Sir,

I have the honour to submit my Report on Crime for the year ended 30th September, 1964.

Hereafter in this report the year ended 30th September, 1964, is referred to simply as "1964". References to years 1958 to 1962 are also to be taken as referring to years ended 30th September. References to years prior to 1958 relate to calendar years.

PART 1,

INDICTABLE OFFENCES.

Total number of Offences.

- (1) The number of indictable offences which were reported or became known to the Garda in 1964 was 17,700. The number in 1963 was 16,203 and the number in 1962 was 15,307. The 1964 total shows an increase of 1,497 on the 1963 total and of 2,393 on the 1962 total.
- (2) Details of the crimes and information on the results of proceedings are given in Appendix "A".

Detections.

- (3) Proceedings were instituted in respect of 10,214 offences in 1964. In 1,060 other cases the offenders were detected but for various reasons proceedings were not instituted. In most of those cases the offences were taken into consideration by the courts in dealing with other charges. The total number of offences detected was therefore 11,274 or 64% of offences recorded. In 1963 the percentage was 69% and in 1962 was 66%.
- (4) The incidence of indictable offences and detections in the years 1954 to 1964 inclusive, are shown as a graph in Appendix "B".

Incidence of Crime in Garda Divisions.

- (5) During the year 1964 the former division of Dublin-Wicklow was abolished and incorporated in adjoining divisions the major portion being taken in the Dublin Metropolitan Area.
- (6) The number of indictable offences recorded and detected in each of the 19 Garda Divisions into which the State is now divided are shown in Appendix "C". Similar information in respect of the Garda Districts in which the cities of Cork, Limerick, Waterford and Galway are included, is also given there.
- (7) The following table shows the number of offences recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Area and the rest of the State in 1963 and 1964.

(8) The increase in offences in the Dublin Metropolitan Area and the decrease in the rest of the State is mainly due to the incorporation of practically all of the former division of Dublin-Wicklow in the Dublin Metropolitan Area in 1964_{\circ}

Group 1 - Offences against the Person.

- (10) This group includes Murder, Manslaughter, Dangerous Driving Causing Death and Serious Bodily Harm, Wounding, Assault, Intimidation, Cruelty to and Abandoning Children and Sexual Offences.
- (11) The following table gives comparative figures of offences and detections in the years 1959 to 1964, inclusive.

Murder of Persons aged above One Year.

(12) Six murders of persons aged above one year were recorded in 1964. Proceedings were instituted in all cases. Brief particulars of the cases are given in Appendix "D". Four crimes were recorded in 1963.

Murder of Infants aged One Year and Under.

(13) No crime of murder of infant was recorded in 1964 nor in 1963.

Infanticide.

(14) Three crimes of Infanticide were recorded in 1964. Brief particulars are included in Appendix "D". No crime of this nature was recorded in 1963.

Attempt to Murder.

(15) One crime of attempting to murder was recorded in 1964 and proceedings were instituted. Brief particulars are included in Appendix "D". Two crimes were recorded in 1963.

Threats to Murder.

(16) Two crimes of threatening to murder were recorded in 1964 in each of which proceedings were instituted. Brief particulars are included in Appendix "D". No crime was recorded in 1963.

Manslaughter (other than Traffic Fatalities).

(17) Five crimes were recorded in 1964 as compared with one in 1963. Proceedings were instituted in all cases. Brief particulars are given in Appendix "D".

Manslaughter (Traffic Fatalities).

(18) Three crimes of manslaughter arising from traffic fatalities were recorded in 1964. Convictions were recorded in two cases and one case is shown awaiting trial. In one case three persons were convicted. In this case two cars each with driver and passenger engaged in racing on the public road. One of the cars crashed and the passenger received fatal injuries. The other three persons involved were each convicted of manslaughter and were sentenced to 18 months imprisonment.

Dangerous Driving causing Death.

(19) A total of 83 persons were charged in 1964, with dangerous driving causing death as compared with 112 persons charged in 1963. Convictions were recorded against 10 persons within the year and 17 cases are shown pending.

Dangerous Driving Causing Serious bodily harm.

(20) One hundred and two persons were charged with this offence during 1964 as compared with 140 in 1963. Convictions were recorded against 23 persons and proceedings are shown pending against 25.

Group 11 - Offences against Property with Violence.

- (21) Included in this group are offences of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences, Robbery and Malicious Injury to Property.
- (22) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1964 was 4,282 as compared with 4,006 in 1963, an increase of 276 which was recorded mainly in "Housebreaking" offences.
- (23) Comparative figures of offences and proceedings in this group in the years 1959 to 1964 inclusive are given in the following table:

Burglary and Housebreaking,

- (24) The number of offences of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences (including attempts to break into premises and possession of housebreaking implements) recorded in 1964 was 4085 as compared with 3841 in 1963. Proceedings were instituted in 2723ccases in 1964 and in additional 250 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings are shown giving a total of 2973 detections or 73%. The percentage in 1963 was 76%.
- (25) The following table shows the numbers of Burglaries Housebreakings and related offences recorded in the years 1959 to 1964 inclusive.

Robbery.

(26) Sixty-two offences of robbery and assaults with intent to rob were recorded in 1964 as compared with 42 offences in 1963. Proceedings were instituted in 53 cases. Convictions were recorded in 35 cases for the year and in a further 4 cases the Probation of Offenders Act was applied. Twelve cases are shown still pending. Firearms were alleged to have been used in two cases brief particulars of which are given in Appendix "E" together with particulars of some other cases.

Arson and other Malicious Injury to Property.

(27) One hundred and twenty-seven offences under this heading were recorded in 1964, of which \$5 were offences of Arson. In 1963 the total of offences was 122 of which 51 were offences of Arson. Proceedings were instituted in 79 cases in 1964 and in a further 8 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken.

Group 111 - Offences against Property without Violence.

- (28) Included in this group are offences of Larceny, Embezzlement, Obtaining Goods, etc., by False Pretences, Frauds and Receiving Stolen Goods.
- (29) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1964 was 11,972 as compared with 10,823 in 1963.
- (30) Proceedings were instituted in 6059 cases and in an additional 761 cases the offenders were detected but proceedings were not taken. The total of detections therefore, was 6820 or 57%. The detection percentage in 1963 was 63% Convictions were recorded in 3334 cases in 1963 and in an additional 2038 cases the Probation of Offenders Act was applied. 699 Jases are shown pending.

(33) Of the total larcenies recorded in 1964, 7,331 or almost 66% were recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Area, as compared with 60% in 1963. The higher percentage in 1964 is mainly attributable to the expansion of the Area earlier referred to.

Embezzlement.

(34) Seventy-one offences of embezzlement were recorded in 1964, as compared with 38 in 1963. Proceedings were instituted in 67 cases and an additional 2 cases were detected but no proceedings are shown.

Obtaining Goods etc., by False Pretences.

(35) Three hundred and eighty one offences under this heading were recorded in 1964, as compared with 521 in 1963. Proceedings were instituted in 303 cases and in an additional 17 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings are shown.

Frauds.

(36) Eighty seven frauds were recorded in 1964 as compared with 75 in 1963. Proceedings were instituted in 74 cases and an additional nine cases were detected but no proceedings are shown.

Receiving Stolen Goods.

(37) Two hundred and eighty three offences under this heading were recorded in 1964, as compared with 227 in 1963. Proceedings were taken in 265 cases and an additional 16 cases were detected but no proceedings are shown.

Group 1V - Other Indictable Offences.

- (38) Included in this group are offences of Forgery and Uttering, Perjury, Bribery, Riot and Unlawful Assembly. Offences against the Coinage Acts, Offences against Public Decency, Attempting to Commit Suicide, Offences against the Treason Act and the Offences against the State Act and other indictable offences not included in Group 1, 11 or 111.
- (39) The total of offences recorded in the group in 1964 was 401 of which 315 were offences of Forgery and Uttering. In 1963 the number of offences was 327 of which 262 were offences of Forgery and Uttering. Proceedings were taken in 339 offences in 1964 and a further 17 cases were detected but no proceedings are shown.

Organised Crime of Violence.

(40) No organised crimes of violence were recorded in 1964 nor were any such crimes recorded in 1963.

Value of Property Stolen and Recovered.

- (41) The total value of property reported stolen in 1964 was £386,806, as compared with £240,961 in 1963. The value of property recovered in 1964 was £83,121 as compared with £74,128 in 1963.
- (42) In offences against property with violence, (i.e. housebreakings) the value of property reported stolen in 1964 was £126,693 of which property valued £33,550 was recovered. In 1963 the value of property stolen was £101,171 and £26,231 recovered.
- (43) In offences against property without violence (i.e. larcenies) The value of property reported stolen in 1964 was £260,113 of which £49,571 was recovered and in 1963 was £139,790 of which £47,897 recovered.

(44) The following table shows the age groups of persons found guilty of indictable offences, including persons against whom the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied, in the years 1959 to 1964 inclusive.

MURDER, INFANTICIDE, ATTEMPTS TO MURDER, THREATS ETC., TO MURDER AND MANSLAUGHTER.

PARTICULARS OF CASES.

Murder - (of persons aged above one year) - Six cases.

Co. Cavan - On 9th November, 1963, a 34 year old liberty patient at a mental hospital left without permission and travelled a distance to his home where he attacked his wife, 37 years, and inflicted fatal injuries. An arrest was made and while on remand the accused was found to be insane and was ordered to be detained in the Central Mental Hospital.

Co. Cork. On 14th November, 1963, a 36 year old patient at a mental hospital fatally stabbed a 32 year old fellow patient with a carving knife. An arrest was made. The accused was found unfit to plead and was ordered to be detained in the Central Mental Hospital.

Dublin Metropolitan Area - On 15th December, 1963, a 65 year old housewife was fatally struck on the head with a hammer by her 27 year old unemployed son. An arrest was made. The accused was ordered to be detained in the Central Mental Hospital.

Dublin Metropolitan Area. - On 4th January, 1964, a 58 year old shop assistant was attacked in her shop by a man who was accompanied by a female. An iron bar was used by the assailant who having inflicted fatal head injuries took away the cash from the till. A 20 year old male and a 20 year old female were charged with the crime. The male was sentenced to penal servitude for life and the female was found not guilty.

Co. Cork. - On 25th April, 1964, a 51 year old farmer was attacked in his bedroom by an intruder whom he disturbed. He was struck several times with an iron bar and received fatal injuries. A 32 year old farm labourer was charged and was sentenced to penal servitude for life.

Co. Kildare - On 27th June, 1964, a 28 year old housewife was attacked in her home by her 36 year old husband, no occupation, who inflicted fatal injuries by stabbing her with a knife and a slash hook. The offender was sentenced to ten years penal servitude.

Infanticide - Three Cases.

Co. Cavan. On 10th October, 1963 the dead body of a male infant was found in a drain near the public road. The head was severely injured and blood stained stones lay nearby. A 16 year old girl was charged with murder. The charge was reduced to infanticide and the Probation of Offenders Act was applied.

Dublin Metropolitan Area - On 6th March, 1964, the dead body of a male infant was found in a church porch. Death was due to suffocation. A 26 year old chemists assistant was charged with murder. She was convicted of infanticide and a suspensory sentence of twelve months imprisonment was imposed.

Co. Laois - On 12th September, 1964, the dead body of a female infant, with a piece of cloth tied tightly around its neck, was found in a hedge by the roadside. Death had been caused by strangulation. A 22 year old itinerant was charged with murder. She was convicted of infanticide and a suspensory sentence of twelve months imprisonment was imposed.

Attempt to Murder - one case.

Co. Westmeath - On 15th January, 1964, a three weeks old female infant was found unconcious in its cot in a hospital ward. Its mother aged 174 years, was standing by and admitted that she had intended to choke it. She was charged with attempted murder and was dealt with under the Probation of Offenders Act.

Threats etc., to Murder - Two cases.

Co. Clare. - On 26th October, 1963, a 19 year old waitress received a letter, through the post, threatening to kill her unless she gave up the company of a new boy friend. A 31 year old labourer, a former boy friend of the injured party was arrested and charged. The case was dealt with under the Probation of Offenders Act as the injured party and the accused had settled their differences and were arranging to be married.

Co. Longford - On 15th November, 1963, a 50 year old widow received, through the post, a letter threatening to kill her. A 22 year old seaman, a nephew of the injured party, was arrested and charged. He was sentenced to six months imprisonment.

Manslaughter - (other than traffic fatalities) - Five cases.

Co. Offaly - On 16th December, 1963, during an altercation on a licensed premises, a 56 year old, married, motor salesman was struck a blow in the face and knocked from his seat. It did not appear that he had suffered any injury but on 19th December, 1963, he was admitted to hospital in a semi-conscious condition and he died on 22nd December, 1963, without regaining consciousness. The cause of death was Cardio-Respiratory failure resulting from a minor head injury. The assailant was arrested and charged with manslaughter. The charge was later withdrawn.

Dublin Metropolitan Area. - On 29th January, 1964, a 59 year old labourer was assaulted outside a licensed premises. He was knocked to the ground and received fatal head injuries. His assailant was charged with manslaughter. He was found "not guilty".

Co. Kilkenny - On 30th March, 1964, an 84 year old spinster was strangled in her home. Her 54 year old nephew-in-law who resided with her was arrested and charged with murder to which charge he pleaded "not guilty" He was convicted of manslaughter and sentenced to ten years penal servitude.

Dublin Metropolitan Area. - On 18th April, 1964, a 30 year old, labourer, was assaulted, in the public street, by a 48 year old, labourer. He was knocked to the ground. His head came in contact with a low wall and he sustained fatal injuries. The assailant was convicted of manslaughter and a suspensory sentence of six months imprisonment was imposed.

Co. Galway. - On 22nd May, 1964, a 22 year old, married, female, itinerant, was struck on the head with a bottle by her 26 year old niece during an altercation in the public street. She died from her injuries on 28th May, 1964. Her assailant was arrested and charged with murder. She pleaded guilty to "manslaughter" and was sentenced to five months imprisonment.

ROBBERY.

PARTICULARS OF ROBBERIES WITH ARMS AND SOME OTHER OF THE MORE SERIOUS ROBBERIES.

Dublin Metropolitan Area. - On 21st May, 1964, at about 5.40 p.m. two men entered a bookmakers office, one of them presented a gun at the only employee on the premises and demanded the cash. The employee resisted and endeavoured to reach the telephone. A struggle ensued during which a shot was fired and the employee had her glasses knocked off and was struck on the head with the gun. The assailants disconnected the telephone and made off with a bag containing £170. No one has been made amenable.

Dublin Metropolitan Area. - On 15th September, 1964, at 9.30 a.m. a man carrying a D.B. Shotgun entered a sub post office. He presented the gun at the assistant and demanded that she hand over the money. The assistant handed over £15 and the assailant hurriedly left and jumped into a vaiting car in which another man was seated and got away. Two persons, both aged 21 years, were arrested and charged with this crime. One was sentenced to five years penal servitude and the other to 3 years penal servitude.

Co. Cork. - On 19th January, 1964, at about 4 a.m. four masked men entered the premises of a bank, made their way to the managers living quarters where they roused him and demanded the keys. The manager was slow to hand over the keys and was assaulted before doing so. The intruders took the manager downstairs to open the strongroom but as only one key was available, the second one was in possession of the teller, the door could not be opened. The men took two cheque books and after warning the manager and his wife not to leave the premises they made away in a car. Three men were arrested and charged in this case. Two of them were each sentenced to five years penal servitude and the third to two years imprisonment.

Co. Kerry. - On 7th January, 1964, at about 7 p.m. the home of an 83 year old retired worker was entered by a man who demanded money. On being refused the intruder attacked the old man, put a leather belt around his neck and threatened to choke him. A struggle ensued and the old man sustained a broken collar bone. A 46 year old man was charged in this case. He was found 'Not Guilty'.
