REPORT.

TO THE RIGHT HON. THE CHIEF SECRETARY FOR IRELAND,

&c., &c., &c.

Metropolitan Police Office, Dublin Castle,
17th May, 1878.

SIR,

I have the honour to transmit for your information, the Annual Criminal and Statistical Returns of the Dublin Metropolitan Police District for the year ended 31st December, 1877.

Indictable Offences.

The total number of indictable offences committed within the police district during the year was 3,292 against 3,447 in 1876, and 3,725 in 1875, being a decrease of 155 offences as compared with 1876, and of 433 as compared with 1875. The total number of persons apprehended on these charges in 1877 was 1,713 against 1,797 in 1876, and 1,697 in 1875, showing a decrease of 84 persons as compared with 1876, and an increase of 16 as compared with 1875. Of the 1,713 persons arrested, 1,080 were males and 633 females; of these 361 males and 181 females were committed for trial at sessions or commission: 124 males and 33 females were bailed to stand their trial; 63 males and 10 females were held to bail, &c., by magistrates, and the residue, viz., 532 males and 409 females, were discharged, either for want of sufficient evidence or through non-attendance of prosecutors, &c.

Cases summarily disposed of.

The total number of persons proceeded against on charges and summonses before magistrates numbered 44,802 against 43,247 in 1876, and 42,439 in 1875, showing an increase of 1,555 as compared with 1876, and of 2,363 as compared with 1875. The 44,802 persons consisted of 31,284 males (against 29,493 in 1876, and 29,557 in 1875,) and 13,518 females (against 13,754 in 1876, and 12,882 in 1875.) The numbers convicted of those summarily disposed of were 28,476 males and 12,141 females, against 26,763 males and 12,522 females in 1876, and 27,199 males and 11,828 females in 1875. The number discharged of those summarily adjudicated on by the magistrates in 1877, amounted to 2,808 males and 1,377 females, against 2,730 males and 1,232 females in 1876, and 2,358 males and 1,054 females in 1875.

Total Number of Persons Apprehended.

The total number of persons apprehended on charges by the police was 27,240 against 27,120 in 1876, and 26,378 in 1875, showing an increase of 120 as compared with 1876, and of 862 as compared with 1875. The 27,240 persons consisted of 17,279 males, (against 16,902 in 1876, and 16,901 in 1875,) and 9,961 females (against 10,218 in 1876 and 9,477 in 1875.)

Murder, Infanticide, &c.

There were three cases of infanticide and 1 attempt to murder an infant in 1877; 5 persons were made amenable in these cases, viz.: 1 male and 3 females for the first-mentioned crime, (1 male and 2 females were discharged by the magistrates, and 1 female sentenced to 7 years penal servitude by Judges) and for the attempt, 1 female was sent for trial and acquitted. There was one man charged for the murder of his wife, but when before the Judges he was allowed to plead guilty to manslaughter and was sentenced to 14 years penal servitude.

Manslaughter, Indecent Offences, Coining, Assaults, and other Offences.

19 males and 2 females were arrested for manslaughter (7 cases of which resulted from the careless driving of vehicles), 49 males and 21 females for shooting, stabbing, &c., calculated to do bodily harm, 8 males for indecent offences, 3 for rape, &c., 3 females for unlawfully abandoning children under 2 years of age, 3 males and 3 females for with-

Inquests.

The number of deaths where coroners' inquests were held in 1877 was 275, against 273 in 1876, and 292 in 1875, showing an increase of 2 as compared with 1876, and a decrease of 17 as compared with 1875.

Juvenile Offenders.

The total number of juvenile offenders committed to reformatories was 87, against 80 in 1876, and 72 in 1875; 211 children were transmitted to certified industrial schools during the year, against 255 in 1876, and 246 in 1875. For offences committed by these children—see Table No. 2, pages 12 and 13, also Table 50, page 56.

Money found on Drunken Persons.

7,703 persons were arrested for drunkenness during the year 1877, having money and other valuable property in their possession amounting to about £20,000, which money and property were handed over by the police to these persons when sober.

Stolen Property Recovered.

The average daily loss sustained by the public from theft or malicious injury is set down at £18 19s. 5½d., against £17 9s. 6d. in 1876, and £24 13s. 8½d. in 1875. The gross loss was £12,600 against £9,490 in 1876, and £16,177 in 1875, and of this sum the police recovered £5,675, against £3,276 in 1876, and £7,167 in 1875. It is necessary to bear in mind that the loss in each case reported to the police is estimated and determined not by them, but by the public who never underrate their loss; and that the area of the Dublin Police District is upwards of 45 square miles, and has spread over its surface an incalculable amount of property, exposed and portable. In many instances property reported to the police as stolen or lost turns out to be only mislaid. The recovery in such cases is rarely reported to the police, therefore the loss is not so much as may appear in Table 29. 45½ per cent. of property stolen has been recovered by the police in 1877, against 34½ per cent. in 1876, and 34½ per cent. in 1875. For full details, see Table 29, page 49.

Public Houses.

The total number of public-houses in the police district open for the sale of spirituous liquors in 1877 was 1,007, being a decrease of 1 as compared with 1876 and of 5 as compared with 1875.

The number of summonses issued against publicans at the suit of the police for violation of the law was 121, against 143 in 1876, and convictions were obtained in 90 cases out of the 121.

Spirit Grocers and Beer Dealers.

The number of spirit grocers within the district in 1877 was 303, being a decrease of 18 as compared with 1876. Of that number 202 are suspected of selling contrary to the tenor of their licences. Summonses were issued in 379 cases against spirit grocers for infractions of the law, and convictions followed in 327 cases. The number of beer-shops was 115, being a decrease of 36 as compared with 1876. 66 of these are suspected of selling contrary to the tenor of their licences; 49 summonses were taken out at the instance of the police against beer dealers for violation of the law, and convictions were obtained in 39 cases. There were 133 houses in which liquor was sold without licence within the police district, showing an increase of 31 as compared with 1876. 315 summonses were issued against the owners of these unlicensed houses for selling liquor, &c., and convictions obtained in 269 instances.

Refreshment Houses.

There are 105 coffee shops and other refreshment houses in the police district, being the same number as in 1876; 93 of these houses were conducted regularly, and 12 irregularly. There were 46 houses having a wine licence only, within the district; all the latter are conducted regularly.

Deserted Children.

The number of children found deserted by the police and others in 1877 was 40, against 29 in 1876, and 31 in 1875. The number of children found dead by the police and others was 32, against 21 in 1876, and 32 in 1875.

Fires.

There were 62 fires during the year, which destroyed property to the value of £42,184, against 51 fires, with a loss of property amounting to £49,697 in 1876. The amount saved was £143,046 in 1877, against £59,795 in 1876. There was not any loss of life on the occasion of these fires in 1877.

Sanitary Proceedings.

The police on sanitary duty within the municipal district during the year, visited 54,356 houses, containing 150,873 rooms, and discovered therein 28,376 sanitary defects, and had 27,919 of that number remedied; 4,842 summonses were issued at the suit of the police, and convictions were obtained in 4,830 instances. The police also made 3,114 visits to nightly lodging-houses, 2,627 visits to slaughter-houses, and 1,392 visits to bake-houses during the year.

Hackney Carriages, Drivers, &c.

In the year 1877 there were within the police district 2,171 licensed vehicles, being an increase of 38 as compared with the year 1876; these vehicles consisted of 1,096 hackney carriages, 862 cabriolets, 131 job carriages, and 82 stage carriages (76 of the latter are tram cars). There were 2,600 licensed drivers, being a decrease of 230 as compared with the year 1876. A general inspection of all vehicles, and drivers thereof, was held in May, and the inspecting officers reported 1,841 vehicles as fit for public accommodation. There were 82 vehicles not produced; the owners of 10 of these vehicles were fined, 1 was cautioned by the magistrates, and the owners of the remainder produced these vehicles after the lapse of a few days, when they were found to be in good working order.

2,357 summonses were issued at the suit of the police for breaches of the Dublin Carriage Regulations, showing an increase of 327 as compared with 1876; they consisted of 1,254 against owners and drivers of hackney carriages, 1,089 against cabriolet owners and drivers, and 14 against owners of job carriages; the average fine imposed in hackney carriage cases was 4s. 8d., cabriolets 3s. 11d. and in job carriage cases 5s.

334 licensed drivers were arrested by the police during the year for breaches of the carriage laws, &c., whilst in charge of their vehicles; for punishments inflicted in these cases, see Table 52, page 58. As a consequence of such offences as appear in this Table, the Commissioner of Police each year (at the time set apart for renewing drivers' licences), after a review of the drivers' characters, refuses to renew the licences of the worst conducted; some are never again relicensed, others are kept out of their licences for certain periods, according to the gravity of their offences, and are not relicensed until satisfactory proof of amendment is given. The refusal to renew the licence has the effect of throwing the driver idle, and proves to him that a strict account is kept, and that he can only hope to obtain his licence by good conduct. The Commissioner's power in this respect is much feared by drivers, and has the effect of restraining many within bounds who would otherwise be very reckless. This year 33 were refused renewal of their licences, many of whom will not be permitted again to renew, and such of them as may be relicensed must be entitled to consideration for honesty, meritorious conduct, &c. There is a decrease of 2 in the number refused renewal as compared with 1876. In addition to those refused renewal, the licences of 14 drivers and 1 conductor were revoked during the year by the Commissioner of Police for misconduct.

It is to be observed that in the majority of offences set forth in Table 51, page 57, particularly as regards the drivers of hackney carriages, &c., the law empowers the magistrate to inflict fines not exceeding 40s., or the alternative of a month's imprisonment.

370 new licences and transfers of hackney carriages and cabriolets were granted during the year, in each instance the vehicle, horse, &c., being inspected and pronounced fit for public use, and the character of the person licensed ascertained to be satisfactory.

671 applications were made for drivers' and conductors' licences during the year; 621 were granted, character being found good; 29 refused, character being unsatisfactory, 6 unable to read, 3 previously charged for lunacy, 2, parents opposing grant of licences, 2 not being requisite age, 3 not having sufficient bodily strength, 1 bearing defective, and 4 failed to follow up applications.

387 hackney carriages and 334 cabriolets were noticed by the police to be in bad repair during the year; the owners were not summoned nor their licences suspended,

but time was allowed them to effect the necessary repairs. This system is adopted where the subject of complaint is of a trivial nature, and a better result is obtained than would be from summons.

The licences of 3 hackney vehicles were revoked in 1877. There was no licence revoked during the year 1876.

Property found in Hackney Carriages.

In 784 instances there were 1,175 articles of property surrendered to the police by drivers, of which number 719 articles were claimed by and given up to the owners at the Police Office, Exchange Court, and 10 at the different station houses, making a total of 729 articles claimed; the remainder were sent to the Police Store, Lower Castle Yard. The articles surrendered included 462 umbrellas, a gold watch, a silver watch, 5 gold rings, 5 silver coins, a gold brooch, a silver wristlet, and other articles of jewellery, also a sewing machine and 12 opera glasses; 4 sovereigns and 12 half-sovereigns were received in mistake for coins of lesser value, in payment of fares, and were surrendered; 2 sovereigns and 2 half-sovereigns were claimed and given up, the remainder were sent into store. In 35 instances, bank notes, gold and silver, amounting in all to £27 3s. were surrendered, of which sum £10 3s. 7d. was not claimed and was sent into store. Cheques and bank receipts for upwards of £130 were also surrendered, all of which were claimed except one £10 cheque.

Property when surrendered at the police stations (except those of F, or Kingstown division), if not claimed immediately, is sent to the carriage branch of the Detective Department, 3, Exchange-court, where it remains for a week, and if not claimed within that time it is sent to the police store.

Recipients of property left rewards for drivers to the amount of £8 17s. during the year.

The police on carriage duty, in the course of their inquiries after such property ascertained that the drivers had surrendered direct to the owners 13 umbrellas, a diamond brooch, 10 gold rings, 2 portmanteaus containing clothing, &c., a trunk, a large box containing butter and eggs, a hat case, 5 coats, 4 rugs, a soldier's kit, 8 reticule bags, a lace handkerchief, a shawl, 2 silver-mounted sticks, and £5 10s. in cash.

POLICE FORCE.

The effective strength of the police force on the 31st December, 1877, was 1,112 men of all ranks.

The force has been now for several years kept up to its authorized strength without any difficulty, and there are at present a large number of approved candidates ready to join as vacancies may arise. The average height of the men of the service is 5 feet 10½ inches; average weight, 12 stone 11½ lbs.

Police Band.

The Dublin Metropolitan Police band consists of thirty-four members (police sergeants and constables), who in addition to attending to their musical performance, also do duty on the streets. The band is now about five years organized, and the expenses connected with it are wholly defrayed by subscriptions from the officers and men of the service.

Work.—In addition to the convictions recorded in this Table, the Commissioners of Police each year lay the time set apart for examining drivers' licenses for the coming year, after examining each driver's character, refuse to renew the license of several of the worst conducted. Some are again offenders; others are kept out of their licenses for some months, according to the gravity of their offences, and are not returned until satisfactory proof of amendment is given. The refusal to renew licenses has the effect of throwing the drivers off, it also serves to limit a strict account of his conduct to kept, and that he can only hope to obtain a license by good behavior. The Commissioner's power in this respect is much abused by drivers, and has the effect of restricting many within proper bounds who might otherwise become very reckless. This year 42 were refused a renewal of their licenses, between 1st of November and the 25th of December, 1877, many of whom will not be permitted again to return, and many of those who are returned need to be kept in consideration for honesty, or other meritorious conduct, &c. There is a decrease of 1 in the number refused in 1877, as compared with 1876. In addition to those refused renewal, the licenses of 18 drivers and 1 conductor were revoked during the year by the Commissioners of Police, immediately on conviction of some of the more grave offences included in this table.

NOTE.—The licences of 11 cabs and 5 outside cars were suspended in 1877 for some reason or other, which shows an increase of 3 cabriolets in suspension, &c., during 1877. In some instances bad vehicles were discovered by the police plying for hire, and when brought to the notice of the owners they were at once taken to the police's possession, and repaired, consequently the licences were not suspended. The licences of 3 vehicles were revoked during the year 1877, none were revoked in 1876. When the licence of a vehicle is revoked, the owner, in order to get it re-licensed, must produce a good vehicle, horse, &c., and pay over again what it cost him to take out the licence in the first instance. This punishment is only resorted to when an owner is in the habit of plying bad vehicles, or otherwise endeavours to trade complying with the law in this respect. In case of a suspension the vehicle is not let to hire until the defect complained of is remedied, and on inspection, if pronounced fit for public use, the licence is restored by the Chief Commissioner of Police. There were 313 cabs and 267 outside cars noticed by the constables on carriage duty during the year, as being in bad repair, the licences of these were not suspended, but the owners summoned, but time was given them to effect the repairs. This system is adopted where the subject of complaint is of a trivial nature, and a better result is had, than by summoning the owners. A general inspection of all hackney-carriages was held in May last, when the inspecting officers reported 1,811 vehicles as fit for public accommodation. There were 23 vehicles not produced; the owners of 18 were found, and 1 was continued by the magistrates, and the remaining 5, which had been undergoing repairs, or absent from other causes, were produced by the owners, after the lapse of a few days in good working order.

In 734 instances there were 1,175 articles of property surrendered to the Police by drivers, of which number 719 articles were claimed by and given to the owners at the Police office, Exchange-court, and 19 at Police stations in the city and F. or Kingstown, Division, making a total of 738 articles claimed; the remainder being sent into the Police stores, Lower Castle-yard.

The articles surrendered included upwards of 462 underclothes of every description, a gold watch, a silver watch, 5 gold finger rings, 2 foreign silver pens, a gold brooch, silver wristlet, and other articles of jewellery, also a sewing machine, and 12 opera glasses.

Four sovereigns and 12 half-sovereigns were received to initiate the value of items of lesser value in payment of fares, and were surrendered; 7 sovereigns and 2 half-sovereigns were claimed and given up, and the remainder sent into store.

In 35 instances, both notes, gold, and silver, amounting to £27 3s. were surrendered, of which sum £10 2s. 7d. was not claimed, and was sent into store. Nine of the cash found, shaggy notes £30, and receipts for upwards of £100 were surrendered, all of which, except one £20 shaggy, were claimed. The money, shaggy, &c., are included in the number of instances above named.

Property when surrendered at the Police stations, except those of F. or Kingstown, Division, if not claimed immediately, is forwarded to the Clerking House of the Detective Department, No. 3, Exchange-court, where it remains for one week, and if not during that time claimed it is sent to the Police stores. The property retained in "F." Division Division, is, after some detection, also sent to the Police stores.

Refunds of property left rewards for the drivers who surrendered it, to the amount of £18 12s. during the year.

SURRENDERED DIRECT TO OWNERS, BY DRIVERS.

The Police on carriage duty, in the course of their inquiries after property reported lost, ascertained that the drivers had surrendered direct to owners—12 underclothes, a diamond brooch, 10 gold finger rings, 2 watchchains, containing wearing apparel, &c., a trunk, a bag box containing letters and eggs, a leather hat-box, 5 coins, 4 travelling bags, a soldier's kit, 6 refills bags, a lace pocket-handkerchief, a shirt, 2 silver mounted sticks, and £5 10s.
