# REPORT.

SIR,

I have the honour to submit the Criminal and Statistical Returns for the year 1911.

## *Indictable Offences*—(TABLES I. AND II.)

The total number of indictable offences committed within the district during the year was 3,429, against 3,347 in 1910, being an increase of 82. They may be classified as follows:—

The total number of persons dealt with summarily for non-indictable offences during the year was 27,050, against 32,194 in 1910, being a decrease of 5,144. They were disposed of as follows:—

*Sentences of Persons Convicted on Indictment.*

Of the 477 persons convicted on indictment, 7 were sentenced to 5 years, 4 to 4 years, and 28 to 3 years' penal servitude, 2 to 2 years, 79 to 12 months and under 2 years, 83 to 6 months and under 12 months, 121 to 1 month and under 6 months, 2 under 1 month, 105 were held to bail, and 46 received other punishment. (See Table II).

*Sentences of Persons Summarily Convicted.*

Of the 20,538 persons summarily convicted on charges by the Magistrates, 1 was sentenced to imprisonment for over 6 months, 127 for 6 months and above 3 months, 207 for 3 months and above 2 months, 424 for 2 months and above 1 month, 712 for 1 month and above 14 days, 465 for 14 days and under, 1 was sent to Place of Detention, 60 were sent to Reformatories, 18,397 were fined, 123 were held to bail, and 21 were otherwise disposed of. (See Table IV.)

*Percentage of the Convictions of Persons made Amenable.*

Of the persons proceeded against by indictment, 72.9 per cent., and of the persons proceeded against summarily, 73.3 per cent. were convicted.

*Probation Orders.*

During the year 1911, 235 Probation Orders were made, 140 of the persons so dealt with being charged with Indictable Offences, and 95 with Non-indictable Offences.

Of the 195 males against whom Probation Orders were made, 34 were under 12 years of age, 52 were aged 12 to 14, 44 were aged 14 to 16, 29 were aged 16 to 21, and 36 were over 21 years.

Of the 40 females against whom Probation Orders were made, 1 was under 12 years of age, 3 were aged 12 to 14, 4 were aged 14 to 16, 9 were aged 16 to 21, and 23 were over 21 years.

In 19 cases the offenders were brought up for sentence after release on Probation Order: 1 was discharged, 1 was committed to an Industrial School, 3 were sentenced to imprisonment, 6 were committed to a Reformatory School, 6 were dealt with for fresh offences, and 2 were otherwise disposed of. (See Table V.)

*Juvenile Courts.*

The number of Children and Young Persons charged with Offences during the year and dealt with in Juvenile Courts was 1,840, viz. :—285 charged with Indictable Offences and 1,555 with Non-indictable Offences. They were disposed of as follows :—

Orders were made against parents or guardians, under Section 99 of the Children Act, 1908, in 3 cases to pay damages or costs, and in 46 cases to enter into recognizances. (See Table IX.)



### *Ages of Persons Arrested and Summarily Convicted.*

Of the 7,809 persons arrested, tried summarily, and convicted, 44 were under 14 years of age, 84 were 14 years and under 16, 642 were 16 years and under 21, 2,660 were 21 years and under 30, 2,171 were 30 years and under 40, 1,360 were 40 years and under 50, 527 were 50 years and under 60, and 321 were 60 years and upwards. (See Table VII.)

### *Education of Persons Arrested and Summarily Convicted.*

Of the 4,627 males arrested and summarily convicted during the year, 357 could neither read nor write, 4,162 could read only or read and write imperfectly, 96 could read and write well, and 12 were of superior education. Of 3,182 females arrested and summarily convicted, 396 could neither read nor write, 2,755 could read only or read and write imperfectly, and 31 could read and write well. (See Table VII.)

### INTOXICATING LIQUOR LAWS.

Each Inspector and Sergeant is required to specially visit licensed premises at uncertain hours during his patrol, for the purpose of detecting breaches of the Licensing Laws.

These officers paid visits during the year—

22,106 to Public Houses.

5,074 to Spirit Grocers and Beer Dealers.

Total, 27,180

*Offences by Licensed Persons.*—74 publicans, 12 spirit grocers, and 6 beer dealers were prosecuted during the year. Total 92, as compared with 149 in year 1910, being a decrease of 57. 22 cases were dismissed with caution, 18 without caution, and 52 were convicted and fined in sums varying from £1 to £10.

In 1 case the conviction was directed to be recorded on the licence. (See Table X.)

*Drunkenness.*—The charges of drunkenness, not combined with any other offence, numbered 1,913, viz., 1,165 males and 748 females, against 2,462, viz., 1,483 males and 979 females, in 1910, and 2,445, viz., 1,550 males and 895 females, in 1909.

The number arrested for being drunk and disorderly was 944, viz., 479 males and 465 females, against 1,109, viz., 542 males and 567 females, in 1910, and 943, viz., 466 males and 477 females, in 1909.

The number arrested for drunkenness, combined with offences other than disorderly conduct, was 53, against 95 in 1910, and 125 in 1909. These cases are included in Table No. III. under the more serious offence, viz., assault, or wilful damage, &c., and are not included under drunk or drunk and disorderly.

The total number of persons who were drunk when arrested by the police during the year was 2,968 against 3,758 in 1910, and 3,601 in 1909. (See Table X.)

*Licences opposed by the Police.*—Sixty-five applications for new, renewal, and transfer licences were opposed by the Police at Licensing Sessions. Forty-four were granted, and twenty-one refused. (See Table XIII.)

*Previous Convictions for Drunkenness.*—104 persons were convicted of drunkenness three and less than five times, 26 five and less than ten times during the year. Total 130, against 175 in 1910, being a decrease of 45. (See Table XIV.)

### *Dogs.*

15,488 dogs were licensed during the year; 2,183 stray dogs were seized by the Police, and conveyed to the "Dogs' Home." Of this number 1,847 were destroyed, 87 restored to owners, 221 sold, and 3 died.

The Police applied for summonses against 1,157 persons for keeping unlicensed dogs, and of 1,801 persons who were prosecuted for having unlicensed, stray, or unmuzzled dogs, 333 were discharged, 1,341 were fined under 5s. each, and 127 in sums varying from 5s. to £1. (See Table XV.)

### *Persons under Police Supervision.*

Sixty persons were under Police observation in Dublin during the year. Of this number 1 left for other districts in Ireland, 1 absconded, 10 were sent to Prison, 3 left Ireland, and in 5 cases the Supervision was remitted by His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant. (See Table XVI.)

### *Thieves and Persons of known Bad Character.*

The number of thieves and persons of known bad character at large within the Police District in the month of April, 1911, was 61 against 56 in 1910, being an increase of 5 as compared with the latter year. (See Table XVIII.)



*Stolen Property recovered.*

The average actual daily loss sustained by the public from theft, &c., is set down at £11 18s. 3d., against £11 3s. 3d. in 1910, and £10 3s. 5d. in 1909. The gross loss was £6,477, against £6,404 in 1910, and £5,568 in 1909.

32.9 per cent. of property stolen has been recovered by the Police in 1911, against 36.4 per cent. in 1910, and 33.3 per cent. in 1909. (See Table XIX.)

Since the year 1901 the number of Cabs has increased from 600 to 636—6 per cent. The number of Outside Cars has decreased from 1,052 to 785—25.38 per cent., within the same period.

An inspection of all Hackney Vehicles was held in May, and the owners of vehicles observed to be unserviceable were required to have them properly repaired.

The proceedings taken by the Police to enforce the Dublin Carriage Regulations are shown in Tables XXI. and XXII. There is a decrease of 205 in the summons cases, and a decrease of 45 in the number of arrests, as compared with the year 1910.

The Licences of 3 outside cars and 3 cabs were temporarily suspended, and one driver was refused renewal of his Licence.

*Property found in Hackney Vehicles.*—There were 262 articles of property surrendered to the Police by drivers during the year, of which number 151 were claimed. The articles included 133 umbrellas and walking sticks, a gold watch, 3 gold bangles, 2 gold brooches, 4 opera and field glasses, a camera, several coats, rugs, &c.

Two half-sovereigns were received by drivers in mistake for silver coin. Sums of money amounting to £1 5s. 1d. were found in vehicles and surrendered by the drivers to the Police.

The effective strength on 31st December, 1911, was 1,202 of all ranks, and the number of removals from the Force through all causes during the year was 65.

*Area and Boundary of the Police District.*

The area of the Dublin Metropolitan Police District is about 36 square miles. The boundaries of the District and of each Police Division are stated at page 32.

*Population of the Police District.*

The population according to the Census of the year 1911 is 415,866.

## GENERAL.

The gross expenditure on the Dublin Metropolitan Police Establishment (*i.e.*, Police and Police Courts), in the financial year ended 31st March, 1911, was Police, £153,678, and Police Courts, £9,497, total £163,175, of which the proportion paid out of moneys voted by Parliament was £106,891.

A Police Tax is established by 1 Vict., cap. 25, and 61 and 62 Vic., cap. 37, sec. 66, at 8d. in the £1, which yielded in that year £30,028 from the City and £15,768 from the County (*i.e.*, the full amount less 5 per cent. paid to the Corporation and to the County Council for the collection of the Tax, and also less the certified proportion of the former Collector-General's annuity).

These sums amount to about 18·4 per cent. and 9·6 per cent. respectively of the gross expenditure on the Establishment.

Other sums appropriated in aid of the cost of the Establishment (Police and Police Courts) in the same year amounted to £10,488, as follows:—

The pay of the Force, including Superintendents, Inspectors, Station Sergeants, Sergeants, and Constables was £98,909.

The mean rateable value of the Dublin Metropolitan Police Area for the year 1910-1911 was £1,472,180, of which £963,831 falls in the City and £508,349 in the County.

## MEDICAL OFFICER'S REPORT on the HEALTH of the DUBLIN METROPOLITAN POLICE FORCE for the Year 1911.

The daily average per-centage of men sick during the past year was 2·8, a small increase over that of 1910. This increase was due to an outbreak of typhoid fever at Kevin-street Barrack. There were eleven cases and these accounted for 891 days. One of these men, I regret to say, died.

The total number of deaths from all causes was 6, being a death rate of 4·9.

The general health of the men was good, but influenza still continues to be the cause of very considerable illness amongst the men.
