1. ***National/International Security*** - To maintain National and International Security through a secure democracy and response capability benchmarked against best international practice.
2. ***Crime*** - To significantly reduce the incidence of crime and criminal behaviour by reducing overall crime by 2% and increasing the detection rate by 2%.
3. ***Traffic and Road Safety*** – To significantly reduce the incidence of fatal and serious injuries and improve road safety by reducing fatal & serious injury traffic collisions in line with Government Road Strategy.
4. ***Public Order*** - To significantly reduce the incidence of public disorder and anti-social behaviour in our communities by reducing the number of youths involved in crime and increasing the Garda satisfaction rate by 2%.
5. ***Ethnic and Cultural Diversity*** - To provide equal protection and appropriate service, while nurturing mutual respect and trust by increasing public confidence by 2%.
6. ***Community Engagement*** - To build a Garda service that reflects the needs and priorities of the people of Ireland.
