Dear Mr. Dunne,

I refer to your request, dated and received on the 5th July 2017 which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 (FOI Act) for records held by An Garda Síochána.

Part 1(n) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act states that An Garda Síochána is listed as a partially included agency "insofar as it relates to administrative records relating to human resources, or finance or procurement matters". Therefore, only administrative records that relate to human resources, finance or procurement shall be considered.

Your request sought:

'Under the Freedom of Information Acts 2014, I am requesting the following information.

- 1: How much was spent by the Gardaí on the security operation for the recent visit of Prince Charles.
- 2: How many extra gardaí were deployed to work during the visit.
- 3: A list of threats that were received by gardaí in relation to the visit of Prince Charles and his wife, Camilla.'

The FOI Act does not confer a general right of access to information; rather it confers a right of access to records. Therefore, your request for information has been treated as a request for access to records containing the information you seek.

I have now made a final decision to <u>partially grant</u> your request on the 28th July 2017. The purpose of this letter is to explain my decision.

1. Findings, particulars and reasons for decision

Details of your request were provided to the Finance Section within An Garda Síochána who conducted a search for records relating to your request on the Financial Management System (FMS).

I have made a decision to grant Part 1 of your request 'How much was spent by the Gardaí on the security operation for the recent visit of Prince Charles'.

The visit of HRH the Prince of Wales and HRH the Duchess of Cornwall required security arrangements to be put in place by An Garda Síochána to ensure the safety of the visitors and the maintenance of public safety. The total expenditure from 1st January 2017 to 24th July 2017 in respect of the official visit was €2,119,742.

Please note that some of the expenditure associated with this figure may relate to the official visit of HRH the Prince of Wales in 2016. This may be due to a delay in the submission of financial claims. It is not practical to review all financial claims made in 2017 with regard to the visits of HRH Prince of Wales as this would involve a manual trawl of the financial records in an effort to identify those relating to 2017 only. Notwithstanding the aforementioned the possible amount relating to delayed payments for 2016 should not be of significance in the expenditure relating to 2017.

As there is no activity based costing system in An Garda Síochána it is not possible to provide a total cost for an activity which includes salaries. Therefore the expenditure provided excludes salaries.

I also wish to advise that I have made a decision to <u>refuse Part 2</u> and Part 3 of your request shown below.

Part 2: How many extra gardaí were deployed to work during the visit.

Part 3: A list of threats that were received by gardaí in relation to the visit of Prince Charles and his wife, Camilla.'

Part 1(n) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act states that An Garda Síochána is listed as a partially included agency "insofar as it relates to administrative records relating to human resources, or finance or procurement matters". Therefore, only administrative records that relate to human resources, finance or procurement shall be considered.

Parts 2 and 3 of your request relate to operational policing matters which do not come within the ambit of this partially included agency as set out in Part 1(n) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act.

I am therefore refusing your request as it is falls outside the scope of the FOI Act insofar as it pertains to An Garda Síochána.

2. Right of Appeal

The review will involve a complete reconsideration of the matter by a more senior member of An Garda Síochána and the decision will be communicated to you within 3 weeks. The making of a late appeal may be permitted in appropriate circumstances.
