I refer to your request, dated and received on the 17th January 2017, which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 (FOI Act) for records held by An Garda Síochána.

Part 1(n) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act states that An Garda Síochána is listed as a partially included agency "insofar as it relates to administrative records relating to human resources, or finance or procurement matters". Therefore, only administrative records that relate to human resources, finance or procurement shall be considered

Your request sought:

'Could you provide information on the garda overtime bill for 2016, specifically a division by division breakdown and how many staff availed of overtime in each division. I also wish to obtain information on the gardai who earned the most overtime in 2016. Could you provide information on the top 5 earners, where they were stationed and how much they earned'

I wish to inform you that I have decided to grant your request on the 22nd February 2017. Appendix A refers.

The purpose of this letter is to explain my decision.

1. Findings, particulars and reasons for decision.

Details of your request were forwarded to the Finance Directorate within An Garda Síochána who conducted a search of their records and identified the records attached at Appendix A. The figures attached show the overtime expenditure for the 29 Operational Garda Divisions.

The number of staff attached is the number of staff who claimed overtime in each of these Divisions.

The nature of Garda work and the requirement that the Garda authorities respond, in some cases at short notice, to immediate policing demands means that there is a necessity to incur overtime expenses to ensure effective policing. Accordingly, there will always be a need for a certain level of overtime to allow An Garda Síochána flexibility when responding to circumstances that require additional resources for specific operations. These additional resources will have to be over and above those available from Gardaí on rostered duty thus ensuring the continuation of normal policing duties unabated.

In addition a number of police led operations, in various years, required the deployment of extra resources on overtime. This includes the implementation of anti-crime and anti-burglary initiatives such as Operation Anvil and Operation Thor. Similarly non-crime related events and events organised by interest groups within the general public can require overtime to police effectively as additional Gardaí may need to be deployed to ensure public safety.

The second part of your request sought the top 5 overtime earners in 2016 and their rank. Please see below this information as requested. It should be noted that overtime is only payable to members at Garda, Sergeant and Inspector Rank.
