Sir.

I have the honour to submit my Report on Crime for the year ended 30th September, 1961.

Hereafter in this Report the year ended 30th September, 1961, is referred to simply as "1961" and the year ended 30th September, 1960, is referred to as "1960".

PART I.

INDICTABLE OFFENCES.

Total number of Offences.

- (1) I am happy to be able to report that the reduction in indictable crime shown in the 1960 return was maintained in 1961.
- The number of indictable offences which were reported or became known to the Gardaí in 1961 was 14,818. The number in 1960 was 15,375 and the number in 1959 was 17,865. The 1961 return shows a reduction of 557 on the 1960 return and a reduction of 3047 (or 17%) on the 1959 return.
- (3) Details of the crimes and information on the results of proceedings are given in Appendix A.

Detections.

- Proceedings were instituted in respect of 8,935 offences in 1961. In 903 other cases the offenders were detected but for various reasons proceedings were not instituted. In most of those cases the offences were taken into consideration by the Courts in dealing with offenders on other charges. The total number of detections was therefor 9,838 or 66% of the crimes recorded. In 1960 the percentage was 60% and in 1959 was 50%
- (5) The incidence of crimes and percentages of detections during the years 1951 to 1961 inclusive, are shown as a graph in Appendix B.

Incidence of Crime in Garda Divisions.

- (6) The number of crimes recorded and detected in each of the 20 Garda Divisions into which the State is divided is given in Appendix C. Similar information is also given there in respect of the Garda Districts in which the cities of Cork, Limerick Waterford and Galway are included.
- (7) The following table shows the number of offences recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Division and in the rest of the State in the years 1960 and 1961.

- (8) You will note that there was a reduction of 1,072 crimes in the Dublin Metropolitan Division in 1961 following a reduction of 2,475 in 1960. In this division in 1961, 52% of the total crime for the State was recorded as compared with 57% in 1960.
- (9) In the divisions outside Dublin there were increases in crime in eleven divisions and decreases in eight, giving a net increase of 515 crimes. The divisions which showed increases in crime were, Carlow/Kildare, Cavan/Monaghan, Clare, Dublin/Wicklow, Galway W., Kerry, Jeix/Offaly, Limerick, Louth/Meath, Mayo and Tipperary. There was a reduction of crime in Cork City, but there were increases in the cities of Limerick, Waterford and Galway.

Analysis of Offences in four Groups.

(10) The number of indictable offences recorded and the number and percentage of detections in the four offence groups are shown in the following table with comparative figures for 1960.

Group 1 - Offences Against the Person.

- (11) This group includes offences of Murder, Manslaughter, Wounding, Assault, Intimidation, Cruelty to and Abandoning Children and Segual Offences.
- (12) The following table gives comparative figures of offences and detections in the years 1956 to 1961 inclusive:-

Murder - of Persons aged above one year.

Eight murders of persons aged above one year were recorded in 1961 and proceedings were instituted in 5 cases. In an additional case the offender was committed to a mental hospital. In 1960 two murders were recorded. Particulars of the eight cases in 1961 are given in Appendix D.

Murder - of Infants aged one year and under.

(14) Two murders of infants were recorded in 1961 particulars of which are given in Appendix D. One crime was recorded in 1960 under this heading.

Infanticide.

(15) One crime of Infanticide was recorded in 1961.

Particulars are given in Appendix D. One crime was also recorded in 1960.

Attempt to Murder.

(16) One crime was recorded under this heading in 1961. Brief particulars are given in Appendix D. Two crimes were recorded in 1960.

Threats to Murder.

(17) Two crimes of Threatening to murder were recorded in 1961. No crime of this nature was recorded in 1960. Brief particulars of the crimes committed in 1961 are given in Appendix D.

Manslaughter (other than Traffic Fatalities)

(18) Two crimes were recorded under this heading in 1961.
Two crimes were recorded in 1960 also. Brief particulars of the 1961 cases are given in Appendix D.

Manslaughter (Traffic Fatalities)

(19) Forty-four crimes of Manslaughter arising from traffic fatalities were recorded in 1961 - one less than the number in 1960. Proceedings were instituted in 43 cases in 1961 and convictions were recorded in 4 cases. Seven cases are shown pending.

Wounding, Assault, etc.

(20) There was an increase of 59 in the number of Woundings, Assaults, etc., recorded in 1961 as compared with the number in 1960, the totals being 406 and 337 respectively. Proceedings were instituted in 393 cases in 1961 and in an additional four cases

the offenders were detected but proceedings were not taken. Convictions were recorded in 27h cases and in a further 49 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied. 40 cases are shown pending.

Intimidation.

(21) Twelve offences of Intimidation were recorded in 1961 which figure is ten less than the number in 1960. Proceedings were instituted in 1 cases and in a further 2 cases the offenders were detected but proceedings were not taken.

Sexual Offences against Females.

The number of sexual offences against females recorded in 1961 was 148 as compared with 178 in 1960. Proceedings were taken in 110 cases and in an additional 14 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken. Convictions in 1961 totalled 70 and in a further 10 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act was applied. Seventeen cases are shown pending.

Group 11 - Offences against Property with Violence.

- (23) Included in this group are offences of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences, Robbery and Malicious Injury to Property.
- (24) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1961 was 3,186 as compared with 2,982 in 1960. The increase occurred in Housebreaking offences.
- (25) Comparative figures of offences in this group and proceedings in the years 1956 to 1961 are given in the following table.

Burglary and Housebreaking.

- The number of offences of Burglary, Housebreaking and related offences (including attempts to break into houses and possession of housebreaking tools) recorded in 1961 was 3,018 as compared with 2,756 in 1960. Proceedings were commenced in 2,137 cases in 1961 and in an additional 184 cases the offenders were detected, giving a total of 2321 detections. (77%).
- (27) Comparative figures of offences and proceedings in the years 1956 to 1961 inclusive are given in the following table.

Robbery.

- (28) Forty-two offences of Robbery and Assaults with Intent to Rob were recorded in 1961 as compared with 59 in 1960. Proceedings were commonced in 31 cases and convictions were recorded in 26 cases. Two cases are shown pending.
- (29) Firearms were used in two cases, particulars of which and of two other serious cases are given in Appendix E.

Arson and Other Malicious Injury to Property.

- (30) The number of offences recorded under this heading in 1961 was 121. The number recorded in 1960 was 154. Offences of Arson numbered 56 in 1961 as compared with 82 in 1960.
- (31) Proceedings were commenced in 74 cases in 1961 and in a further 9 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken. Convictions were recorded in 52 cases and in an additional 20 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied. Seven cases are shown pending.

Group 111 - Offences against Property without Violence.

- (32) Included in this group are offences of Larceny,
 Embezzlement, Obtaining Goods, etc., by False Pretences,
 Frauds and Receiving Stolen Goods.
- (33) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1961 was 10,623 as compared with 11,470 in 1960. The decrease is wholly accounted for in larcenies. In the Dublin Metroplolitan Division the reduction in larcenies was 1,083.
- Proceedings were commenced in 5,814 cases in 1961 and in a further 659 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken. The total detections in 1961 was therefore 6,473 or 61% as compared with 6,124 or 53% in 1960. Convictions in 1961 numbered 2,646 and in an additional 2,564 cases the charges were held proved and the Probations of Offenders Ast applied. 628 cases are shown pending.

(37) Of the total larcenies recorded in 1961 the number recorded in the Dublin Metropolitan Division was 6198 or 65% of the total as compared with 7281 or 68% in 1960.

EMBEZZIEMENT.

(38) Sixty-two offences of Embezzlement were recorded in 1961 as compared with 48 in 1960. Proceedings were commenced in 58 cases. Convictions were recorded in 24 cases and in a further 20 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied.

Obtaining Goods, etc., by False Pretences.

(39) The number of offences of False Pretences recorded in 1961 was 378 as compared with 423 in 1960. Proceedings were commenced in 299 cases and in an additional 33 cases the offenders

were detected but no proceedings were instituted. Convictions were recorded in 194 cases in 1961 and in 53 other cases the charges were held proved and the Probation Act applied.

Frauds.

(40) Fifty-six offences relating to Frauds were recorded in 1961, five more than the number in 1960. Proceedings were commenced in 53 cases. Convictions were recorded in 38 cases and in a further five cases the Probation of Offenders Act was applied.

Receiving Stolen Goods.

(41) Offences of Receiving Stolen Goods numbered 266 in 1961 as compared with 239 in 1960. Proceedings were commenced in 249 cases and in a further 14 the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken. Convictions in 1961 numbered 108 and in a further 82 cases the Probation of Offenders Act was applied.

Group IV - Offences not included in other Groups.

- (42) Included in this group are offences of Forgery, Perjury, Bribery, Riot and Unlawful Assembly, Offences against Public Decency, Attempting to Commit Suicide, Offences under the Coinage Acts, the Treason Act, the Offences against the State Act and other indictable offences not included in Group 1, 11 or 111.
- (43) The number of offences recorded in the group in 1961 was 308 as compared with 248 in 1960. Proceedings were commenced in 255 cases. Convictions numbered 146 and in a further 54 cases the Probation of Offenders Act was applied.
- (44) A total of 255 offences of Forgery and Uttering was recorded in 1961 as compared with 200 in 1960. Proceedings were commenced in 221 cases and in a further 9 cases the offenders were detected but no proceedings were taken. Convictions were recorded in 129 cases and in an additional 44 cases the charges were held proved and the Probation Act applied.

Organised Violent Crime.

(45) No organised crime of violence was recorded in 1961. Two crimes were recorded in 1960.

Value of Property Stolen and Recovered.

- (46) The total value of property reported as stolen in 1961 was £161,178, as compared with £162,128 in 1960. The value of property recovered in 1961 was £55,612 as compared with £52,159 in 1960.
- (47) In offences against property with violence (e.g. Housebreakings) the value of property reported as stolen in 1961 was £61,005 as compared with £48,729 in 1960. The value of property recovered in 1961 was £16,764 as compared with £15,674 in 1960.
- (48) In offences against property without violence (e.g. larcenies) the value of property reported as stolen in 1961 was £100,173 as compared with £113,399 in 1960 and the value of property recovered was £38,848 as compared with £36,485 in 1960.

Convictions.

The number of persons found guilty of offences charged was 95,472 or 92% of the number prosecuted. Of this number, convictions were recorded against 77,718 and the charges against the remaining 17,754 were held proved and the Probation of Offenders Act applied.

Assault.

(56) A total of 1,373 persons were prosecuted for Assaults in 1961 as compared with 1,255 in 1960. The number found guilty was 1,077.

Dogs - Offences in relation to Licensing of

(57) For offences of keeping unlicensed dogs, the number of persons prosecuted in 1961 was 3,322 as compared with 4,090 in 1960. The number found guilty in 1961 was 3,135.

School Attendance Act.

(58) The number of persons prosecuted for offences against the School Attendance Act in 1951 was 3,219 as compared with 2,903 in 1960. The number found guilty in 1961 was 2,970.

Highway Acts, including Road Traffic Act and Road Transport Acts.

The number of persons prosecuted for offences under the Highway Acts in 1961 was 77,834, which is almost 75% of all prosecutions for the year. The number of prosecutions in 1960 was 68,633 or 67% of all prosecutions in that year. Prosecutions for offences against lighting regulations in 1961 totalled 32,298 as compared with 28,548 in 1960, for offences relating to road tax and driving licences 10,639 as compared with 10,305 in 1960, for dangerous and carcless driving 3,772 as compared with 3,280 in 1960 and for offences of driving or attempting to drive while drunk 651 as compared with 535 in 1960.

Intoxicating Liquor Laws.

- Prosecutions for offences under the Intoxicating Liquor Laws in 1961 totalled 8,256 as compared with 14,818 in 1960. The decrease is shown mainly in prosecutions against persons found on licensed premises during closing hours, for which offence 3,852 persons, almost 48% of the total, were prosecuted in 1961 as compared with 9,628 or 65% in 1960. For offences of drunkenness a total of 3,094 persons were prosecuted in 1961 as compared with 3,180 in 1960 and prosecutions against licensed persons or their servants for offences against Closing Regulations numbered 910 as compared with 1,522 in 1960.

Malicious Damage to Property.

(64) The number of persons prosecuted in 1961 for offences of Malicious Damage to Property was 1,366 as compared with

1,376 in 1960. The number found guilty was 1,114 or almost 82%.

Revenue Laws.

(65) For offences under the Revenue Laws other than dog licensing offences a total of 776 persons were prosecuted in 1961 as compared with 837 in 1960. The number found guilty was 675 or 87%.

Vagrancy Laws.

- (66) For offences against the Vagrancy Laws 833 persons were prosecuted in 1961 as compared with 768 in 1960. The number found guilty was 735 or 89%.
- (67) For offences of "Begging" 509 persons were prosecuted in 1961 as compared with 473 in 1960. 461 persons, almost 91%, were found guilty.



Murder, Infanticide, Attempts to Murder, Threats to Murder and Manslaughter.

Particulars of Cases.

Murder - (of Persons aged above one year) - 8 cases.

- Co. Mayo On 20th February, 1961, a 29 year old Mental Hospital patient was struck on the head with a polishing clamp by a 51 year old fellow patient and received injuries from which he died on 28th February, 1961. The assailant was charged with Murder and was committed to the Central Mental Hospital.
- Co. Waterford On 20th March, 1961, the dead body of a 62 year old farmer, bearing two shot-gun wounds, was found in his farmyard. A 22 year old farm labourer, who had worked for the deceased man, was arrested and charged with his murder. At the Central Criminal Court he was found Guilty but Insane.
 - Co. Cork On 29th March, 1961, the dead body of a 30 year old unmarried woman, bearing serious head injuries, was discovered in a field near a road fence. The woman had left her home at 8.15 p.m., on the previous day. A 20 year old Van Driver was arrested and charged with her Murder. He was convicted and sentenced to death. The sentence was later commuted to life imprisonment.
 - <u>Dublin City</u> At 3 a.m., on 7th April, 1961, a 68 year old night attendant was found unconscious at the garage where he was employed. His head was severely injured and he died on the following day without regaining consciousness. The motive was Robbery.

No one has been made amenable.

- Co. Cork On 5th June, 1961, a 3 year old girl was found unconsious in her parents home. Severe injuries had been inflicted on her head and neck with a butcher's cleaver and she died on 7th June, 1961. The child's mother was committed to a Mental Hospital.
 - <u>Dublin City</u> On 21st June, 1961, at 12.45 p.m., the dead body of a $5\frac{1}{2}$ year old boy, bearing severe head injuries, was discovered in a disused graveyard. The boy had been missing from about 4 p.m. on the previous day and had apparently been lured to the spot where he was battered with a heavy stone.

No one has yet been made amenable.

- Dublin City On 25th June, 1961, the dead body of a 60 year old woman was discovered in a tenement room. Death was caused by manual strangulation. A 63 year old unemployed man who lived in the room was arrested and charged with her murder. He was subsequently committed to a Mental Hospital.
 - Co. Galway On 12th July, 1961, a 60 year old widow, who lived alone, was found in a collapsed condition, with severe head injuries, near her home. She died while being removed to hospital. A 32 year old labourer was arrested and charged with her murder. He is awaiting trial.

(of infants aged one year and under) - 2 cases.

Co. Kerry — On 17th March, 1961, the dead body of a 10 months old female infant, which had been reported missing, was found in a box in the scullery of her parents home. Death was caused by "Asphyxia", the result of inhalation of an oily fluid into the air passages. The infant's mother was arrested and charged. While on remandshe was certified to be insane and was committed to a Mental Hospital.

Dublin City - On 30th May, 1961, the body of a newly born male infant was taken from the River Liffey. The body which was dressed and wrapped in a 3 foot square woollen shawl had been about one month in the water and was in an advanced state of decomposition. Death was due to drowning. No one has been made amenable.

Infanticide - One case.

Co. Meath - On 28th January, 1961, an 18 year old domestic servant gave birth to a female infant at her employer's home. The dead body of the baby, bearing extensive lacerated wounds on the head, was found in her room. The girl was arrested and charged with Murder. She was sent for trial for Infanticide and was found "Not Guilty" and discharged.

Attempt to Murder - One case.

Co. Waterford - On 18th September, 1961, a 24 year old female bookmaker's clerk, was attacked in her place of employment by a man who slung a neck-tie around her neck and pulled her over the counter. He then beat her about the head with a sweeping brush the handle of which broke in several pieces. A short time later a 30 year old unemployed man entered a Garda Station and said he had tried to kill the girl in order to rob the takings. He was charged with attempted Murder and was sentenced to Penal Servitude for 5 years.

Threats, etc., to Murder - 2 Cases.

Co. Kilkenny - On 16th November, 1960, a 44 year old farmer received a letter through the post warning him to clear off lands which he had rented or he would be shot at sight.

No one has been made amenable.

Dublin City. - On 20th July, 1961, and 26th July, 1961, letters, threatening him with death, were received through the post by a 12 year old schoolboy. In one of the letters reference was made to a young schoolboy who was murdered a month previously.

No one has been made amenable.

Manslaughter (other than Traffic Fatalities) - 2 Cases.

Co. Cork - On 16th March, 1961, at 11 p.m., a 20 year old youth was fatally stabbed in the neck with a sheath knife in the course of a street fracas. A youth of 19 years was also stabbed in the thigh. A youth of 17½ years was arrested and charged with Murder. At the Central Criminal Court he pleaded "Not Guilty" to Murder but "Guilty" to Manslaughter. The latter plea was accepted by the Court and he was sentenced to four years detention.

Co. Wexford - On 23rd July, 1961, when a member of the Garda was endeavouring to arrest an itinerant who had assaulted him some civilians went to his assistance. They were set upon by relatives of the itinerant who were armed with stick, stones, bottles and

an iron bar and in the ensuing disturbance the Garda and seven civilians were injured. Some days later the injuries inflicted on one civilian, a 39 year old labourer, turned septic and he was removed to hospital where he died. The itinerant, his wife and two sons were arrested and charged with Murder. Informations were refused against the itinerant and his sons but his wife was sent for trial. She was convicted of Manslaughter and sentenced to eighteen months imprisonment.

Manslaughter - (Traffic Fatality) - One Case.

Co. Galway - On 19th January, 1961, at 12.40 p.m. a 73 year old farmer was found, seriously injured, lying on the public road. He died before he could be removed to hospital. The deceased had apparently been walking up an incline on the road wheeling his bicycle when he was struck by a motor vehicle which did not stop.

The car has not been traced.

ROBBERY.

Particulars of two cases of Robbery with Firearms and two other serious cases.

With Firearms - 2 cases.

Co. Waterford - On 27th December, 1960, at about 10 p.m. a masked man carrying a revolver entered a small dwelling-house, by turning the key which was in a yale lock on the door. He demanded money and having got £1.18.6d., attempted to indecently assault the woman. She resisted and he struck her with the revolver on her head and hand. She was found unconscious on the kitchen floor at 11.10 p.m. by a 17 year old girl who had been to the pictures with her daughter.

No one has been made amenable.

Co. Mayo - On 5th April, 1961, at 9.15 p.m. a 65 year old spinster opened the door of her home, where she resided with her 64 year old brother, a farmer. Two masked men, one of whom carried a revolver entered the kitchen and demanded a D.B. Shot-gun which was in the house. The gun which was standing in the corner was picked up by one of the men who than left the house. The gun has not been traced.

No one has been made amenable.

Other serious cases - (2).

Co. Limerick - On 18th November, 1960, about 4 p.m. a man who had been on the premises of a betting office for some time previously went behind the counter and approached the cash drawer. As he did so the female clerk in the office rushed at him but he pushed her away and grabbed a bag containing £50 and made off.

The employee's spectacles were knocked off and she sustained slight cuts on her face in the struggle.

No one has been made amenable.

Co. Kildare - On 12th December, 1960, a 35 year old housewife was attacked in her home by a man who called and asked to have tea made for him. When in the kitchen this man demanded money and, on being refused, struck the woman on the head with a beet knife and a hatchet inflicting severeinjuries. He then took five one pound notes from her handbag and a gents wristlet watch.

A 28 year old labourer was arrested and charged. He was sentenced to four years Penal Servitude.
