#### The Minister for Justice

Sir.

The following is the annual report on crime which came to the notice of the Garda Siochána during the year ending the 31st December 1983.

A total of 102,387 indictable offences was recorded for the year showing an increase of 4,761 or 4.9% compared with the figures for the previous year. The rate of increase, however, continues to show a reduction, viz., 4.9% this year compared with 9.2% in the previous year and 22.9% in 1981.

The largest increase of 4,904 was in Group II, i.e. Offences Against Property with Violence, which property includes dwelling-houses and other buildings. Groups III and IV, i.e. Larcenies and Miscellaneous Offences, showed a decrease of 127 and 47 respectively. Within Group III, larcenies from unattended vehicles decreased by 1,089.

Firearms were used in the commission of 84 robberies and 341 aggravated burglaries showing an increase of 35 armed crimes over the combined figures of 390 for the previous year. Outside the Dublin Metropolitan Area there was a decrease in this type of armed crime from 119 in the previous year to 102. There was a decrease in armed bank robberies (from 21 in the previous year to 7) and in post office robberies (from 56 in the previous year to 36).

During the year 26 murders were committed, 19 of which were detected. These included the murder in the course of their duties of two members of the Garda Siochána and one member of the Defence Forces. In 1982 there were 24 murders, six of which still remain undetected.

Juveniles under 17 years made amenable for crime and dealt with either by way of caution or through the courts numbered 4,934 and accounted for 31% of the total involved. The number of proceedings commenced in the District Court went up by 1.6%.

Through our own nationwide enforcement activities, together with co-operation from the customs services and outside agencies, a number of significant seizures of illegally held drugs was made. During the period, 1,822 persons were found in illegal possession of drugs and there were 2,278 seizures compared to 1,593 persons and 1,873 seizures in the previous year, an increase of 14.4% and 21.6% respectively.

The training of members of the Force in methods of combating this upsurge in drug abuse continued throughout the year. Each Garda District has now at least 15% of members fully trained in this area. Such training is continuing and will continue until an acceptable level of competence is reached by all members. A programme for the procurement and training of sutiable dogs for drug detection is under way.

Larcenies from vehicles accounted for 21% of the total crime in 1982 and 18.9% in 1983. The increased patrolling by uniformed members in the more densely populated areas is believed to have had positive effects in creating this downward trend. It is intended to continue with this policy.

The Dublin Metropolitan Area accounted for 59.2% of the total crime committed, representing 59.5 crimes per 1,000 of the population. While this high rate of crime in densely populated areas is also experienced in other countries, the figure is unacceptable here. The introduction of extra patrolling in late 1982, the increase of the Force in the Dublin area in 1983 and the coming on-stream of the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme this year should be effective in curbing the lawlessness and vandalism which accounts for a considerable number of these crimes. Of the total number of crimes detected in the D.M.A., 24% were committed by juveniles.

Of continuing concern is this number of children and young persons who become involved in crime. Some offend time and time again and become experienced in a criminal way of life while still in their teens. The continuing inability of social agencies responsible for the welfare of children, to cope with this problem, is a cause of concern and is a contributory factor in the increasing incidence of petty crime and vandalism, particularly in the Dublin Metropolitan Area. Many crimes in that area are committed by comparatively few children and young persons some of whom are free to wander the streets by day and night seeking opportunities to steal from parked cars; grab handbags from women pedestrians, and even to break into business premises and houses, usually causing damage to a value considerably greater than the value of the property they steal. These children are virtually homeless, free as they are from any adequate parental care and control. The provisions of the Children's Acts are not always adequate to meet the problem.

The year saw the emergence of concerned groups of citizens coming together to consider trends and similar problems particularly those relating to drugs, in the Dublin City area. While the interest of such groups has to be welcomed and encouraged, a note of caution has to be expressed. These groups need to be ever alert in maintaining their independence and integrity in the interest of community welfare and in avoiding the encouragement of particular ideologies. The Rule of Law must be observed and the Gardai have a duty to see that this is done.

In the interest of good order and tranquility in society it is necessary that the full weight of public opinion and action be maintained against criminal activity of all kinds. This year we hope to see the further development of our plans to introduce the Neighbourhood Watch Scheme in a number of areas. This Scheme ultimatley belongs to the people with the Gardai acting as advisers and providing whatever co-operative assistance may be necessary.

I should now like to dwell on what I consider to be one of our greatest problems and I refer to the loss of human life on our roads. In 1983, 523 people were killed in 470 road accidents. This was an increase of 8 persons killed on the 1982 figures. This tragic loss of life could be substantially reduced through more care on the roads and, above all, the avoidance of drink while driving. I consider our role in the enforcement of road traffic legislation, particularly in the drink driving area, as one of paramount importance. It will continue to be one of our main objectives in 1984.

I am pleased to record my appreciation of the support received from the public and the media during the year.



### INDICTABLE OFFENCES

Indictable offences which came to the notice of the Garda Siochána during the year ended 31st. December, 1983 numbered 102,387 as compared with 97,626 in the year ended 31st. December, 1982, an increase of 4.9%.

In the Dublin Metropolitan Area (DMA) 60,602 indictable offences were recorded, an increase of 2,850 (4.9%) on the figure for 1982. Of the total crimes recorded in the State 59.2% occurred in the DMA.

The DMA has an estimated population of 1,017,897 based on the 1981 census of population, or 29.6% of the total population of the State.

### CRIME RATE

Based on the 1981 Census of Population, the crime rate per 1,000 of the population was 29.8 with a rate of 59.5 in the D.M.A. and a rate of 17.2 outside of the D.M.A. The following table shows the rate for each division and the Dublin Metropolitan Area which is composed of 5 divisions.



### DETECTION OF CRIME

The overall detection rate in 1983 was 32.9% (33.6% in 1982). The detection rate varies from 82.9% in respect of Offences Against the Person to 31.7% in the less serious forms of larceny.

The total number of indictable offences detected was 33,699. Proceedings were taken in 30,923 cases, and the remaining 2,776 cases (col. 17 of indictable offences table) include cases dealt with under the Juvenile Liaison Scheme.

#### OFFENCES AGAINST THE PERSON (GROUP I)

Murder, manslaughter, dangerous driving causing death, traffic fatalities, possession of firearms with intent to endanger life, assault and related offences comprise this group.

In 1983 a total of 2,306 offences were recorded in this group, an increase of 1.4% on 1982. The detection rate was 82.9% (85.1% in 1982).

The overall figure of 2,306 offences against the person, includes 780 (33.8%) committed in the DMA where the detection rate-was 67.6% (71.6% in 1982).

#### MURDER

There were 26 murders in 1983, seven of which remain unsolved. There were 11 cases of attempted murder.

### MANSLAUGHTER

There were 15 cases of manslaughter in 1983, seven of which arose out of a rail crash and one as a result of a road traffic accident.

### TRAFFIC FATALITIES

There were 523 deaths arising from 470 fatal traffic accidents, an increase of 8 deaths on the 1982 figure of 515. Seven (7) persons (7 in 1982) were charged with dangerous driving causing death and 3 persons (3 in 1982) were charged with dangerous driving causing serious bodily injury.

### OFFENCES AGAINST PROPERTY WITH VIOLENCE (GROUP II)

Offences of burglary, aggravated burglary, robbery, arson and serious malicious damage to property are included in this group. A total of 41,364 offences were recorded in 1983, an increase of 13.5% on 1982 and the detection rate was 31.4% (32.9% in 1982).

Of the total number of offences in this Group 22,661 (54.8%) were committed in the DMA and the detection rate was 31.1% (33.3% in 1982).

### ROBBERY AND AGGRAVATED BURGLARY

There were 2,262 robberies and 816 aggravated burglaries in 1983 showing an increase of 379 and 337 respectively on the figures recorded for 1982. Firearms were used in 84 cases of robbery and in 341 cases of aggravated burglary, a decrease of 74 and an increase of 109 respectively on the previous year. These figures show an overall increase of 35 armed crimes compared to the previous year.

#### ARSON AND MALICIOUS DAMAGE

There were 2,374 cases of malicious damage of which 172 cases were arson; 1,123 (47.3%) were detected. In 1982 the total figure for arson was 172 showing no change for 1983.

### BURGLARY

Offences of burglary numbered 35,826 of which 10,962 (30.6%) were detected. In 1982 a total of 32,141 offences of this nature were recorded showing an increase of 11.5% for 1983.

### LARCENIES ETC. (GROUP III)

Larcenies, forgeries and frauds of various kinds comprise this group. In 1983, 58,283 such offences were recorded and this shows a decrease of 127 (0.2%) on the figure for 1982. A total of 18,479 (31.7%) of these offences were detected. In 1982 detections amounted to 31.6%.

The overall figure of 58,283 offences recorded in this group includes 36,912 (63.3%) committed in the DMA where detections totalled 9,148 (24.8%). In 1982, detections in the DMA totalled 9,041 (24.6%). The number of larcenies from unattended vehicles at 19,434 shows a decrease of 1,089 (5.3%) on the figure for the previous year.

### OTHER INDICTABLE OFFENCES (GROUP IV)

This is a miscellaneous crime group in which 434 offences were recorded. A total of 336 (77.4%) of these offences were detected.

When compared with 1982 the overall figure shows an decrease of 47 (9.8%). Of the total number of offences recorded, 249 (57.4%) were committed in the DMA and 208 (83.5%) of these were detected.





#### CRIME PREVENTION

Garda Crime Prevention officers are available to survey premises and to impart suitable advice to property owners. Such officers are stationed in every division in the country. In the Dublin Metropolitan Area, a specially equipped exhibition room is located at Harcourt Square and up-to-date equipment is always available for public examination.

Special emphasis is placed on the generation of a greater degree of public interest in crime prevention and on the necessity to exercise security measures in relation to property. Advice is given by means of notices in newspapers, magazines and newsletters, by coverage on radio and television programmes and by the distribution of advice leaflets/pamphlets on the occasion of talks, lectures, exhibitions and displays.

The "Garda Patrol" television programme has increased in public popularity and continues to prove of invaluable assistance in the detection of crime. Every opportunity is availed of to acquaint the viewing public on the necessity for and value of crime prevention practices.

No effort is spared to encourage a greater level of interest in crime prevention procedures by the younger members of the Force and more especially those employed on patrolling duties. The daily community contact being made by such members is seen as an ideal base from which to cultivate a greater sense of awareness for, and appreciation of the crime prevention concept.

The media are to be complimented for their responsible approach to the reporting of criminal matters and for the assistance they render in crime prevention.

During the year, thirty-two Crime Prevention Exhibitions were staged on the occasion of events commanding national or regional attention.

#### JUVENILE LIAISON SCHEME

This Scheme has been in operation for twenty-one years and is operated in each Garda Division, providing an alternative to prosecution (subject to certain conditions) for young offenders. Their work includes the rehabilitation of young people in conflict with the law, guiding potential delinquents, and all aspects of youth work.

Juvenile Liaison Officers are specially selected and receive an initial four weeks training course to prepare them to deal with juveniles involved in criminal behaviour and on Garda involvement with young people in general. They have an on-going committment in youth activities and involvement with school children generally.

Juvenile Liaison Officers in the Dublin Metropolitan Area have the use of a personnel carrier at their disposal on a part-time basis. This facility is used for the purpose of taking young people at risk on educational and recreational tours and is also used to transport youth participants to community games and sporting events.

Since the inception of the scheme in 1963, 20,746 offenders have been cautioned and supervised by the Gardai.

### GARDA COMMUNITY RELATIONS

Early in 1983 the strength of the Community Relations Section was increased by the allocation of a Chief Superintendent and a Superintendent. The community relations programmes are designd to foster and inculcate a better understanding of the role of the Gardaí; to liaise with statutory and voluntary associations; to generate public interest and involvement in law and order issues; to seek to regulate and harmonise by instructive encouragement the attitudes of those who may be apathetic towards the Gardaí in their policing role and to engender in the community a level of acceptance for law enforcement and for those whose duty it is to carry it out.

The concept of "Neighbourhood Watch" has been explained to a number of Resident Associations' and Community Groups in the Dublin Metropolitan Area. Neighbourhood Watch is essentially a network of public spirited people who observe what is going on in their own neighbourhood and report suspicious activity to the Gardai in order to protect their property and that of their neighbours, with the object of reducing opportunities for the criminal, making the neighbourhood a safer place to live in and to reduce the fear of crime.

During the year Community Relations officers and Juvenile Liaison officers visited schools where they gave talks on "Young People and the Law" and related subjects. Lectures were given to adult groups on the Garda role and the need for greater co-operation of the community in the solution and prevention of crime.

#### MISUSE OF DRUGS

During 1983 a total of 1,822 persons were charged with offences under the Misuse of Drugs Act, 1977, this compares with a total of 1,593 persons charged in 1982 — an increase of 14.4%.

The total number of seizures of controlled drugs in 1983 was 2,278. In 1982 the figure was 1,873, this shows an increase of 21.6% over 1982.

While there was an increase of 9.1% in the amount of heroin seized, the most significant increase for the year was the amount of cannabis resin seized, which amounted to 485.86 kilogrammes compared with 172.67 kilogrammes in 1982, representing an increase of 181.4%. The larges single seizure of cannabis resin was 300 kilogrammes at Dublin Airport and there was also a very significant seizure of 146 kilogrammes made at Waterford.

The drug training courses which commenced at Garda Headquarters in 1981 continued throughout the year and by the end of 1983 a total of 1,122 membes of all ranks had undergone these courses.

Many notable seizures of drugs were made throughout the year by officers of the Customs Service at various points of entry to the State and their co-operation is very beneficial as almost all drugs abused here are brought into the country.

Throughout 1983 a total of 1,294 talks and lectures relating to drug abuse was given by members of the Gardai to various groups and organisations. This figure compares with 1,039 occasions in 1982 and 438 occasions in 1981. Due to the greater public awareness of the drug problem there is an ever increasing demand of Gardai to give talks on the abuse of drugs to concerned groups.

### SUB-AQUA UNIT

The Garda Sub-Aqua Unit was established in 1966 to carry out searches for:

- (a) Bodies of victims of crime or drowning accidents.
- (b) Weapons used in the commission of crime or other evidence of crime deposited in water.

The Unit carried out 38 major operations during the year in connection with the investigation of crime and search for missing persons. 16 bodies were recovered as a result of underwater searches.

#### THE EMERGENCY 999 SERVICE

During the year 160,138 emergency 999 calls were received by the Garda. 135,376 calls at the Communications Centre, Dublin Castle; 17,081 at the Communications Room, Union Quay, Cork City; 1,347 calls at Eglinton St. Station, Galway City; 2,646 calls at the Communications Room, Henry St. Limerick; 1,601 calls at the Communications Room Waterford; 739 calls at the Communications Room, Letterkenny; 1,294 calls at the Communications Room Dundalk and 45 calls at the Communications Room, Portlaoise.

#### STOLEN MOTOR VEHICLE INVESTIGATION UNIT

This Unit which operates for the whole country is based in Dublin. Close liaison is maintained with similar units in other countries and this co-operation has led to the recovery of many stolen vehicles. 1,531 of these were recorded as stolen. 1,187 of the vehicles recorded as stolen were motor cars, motor vans and lorries, while 344 were motor cycles. 360 vehicles, bearing false registration plates were discovered by the Unit during the year.

#### ROAD TRAFFIC

There were 470 fatal traffic accidents during the year resulting in the deaths of 523 people. These figures show an increase of 8 in the numbers killed and 1 in the number of accidents compared to the figures for the previous year.

#### PUBLIC RELATIONS AND PRESS OFFICE

The commission of serious crimes during the year attracted the attention of the national and international media and the Garda Press and Public Relations Office subsequently dealt with an inordinately high number of media queries. In this matter the assistance and co-operation afforded during the year by media management was much appreciated.

With the Public Relations and Press Office open only during normal working hours, the conveyance of information at night and over week-ends, by the Communications Office, Dublin Castle, was welcomed by journalists.

During the year there was a significant increase in the demand for Garda participation in Career Seminars and Exhibitions as well as calls to the General Office.
