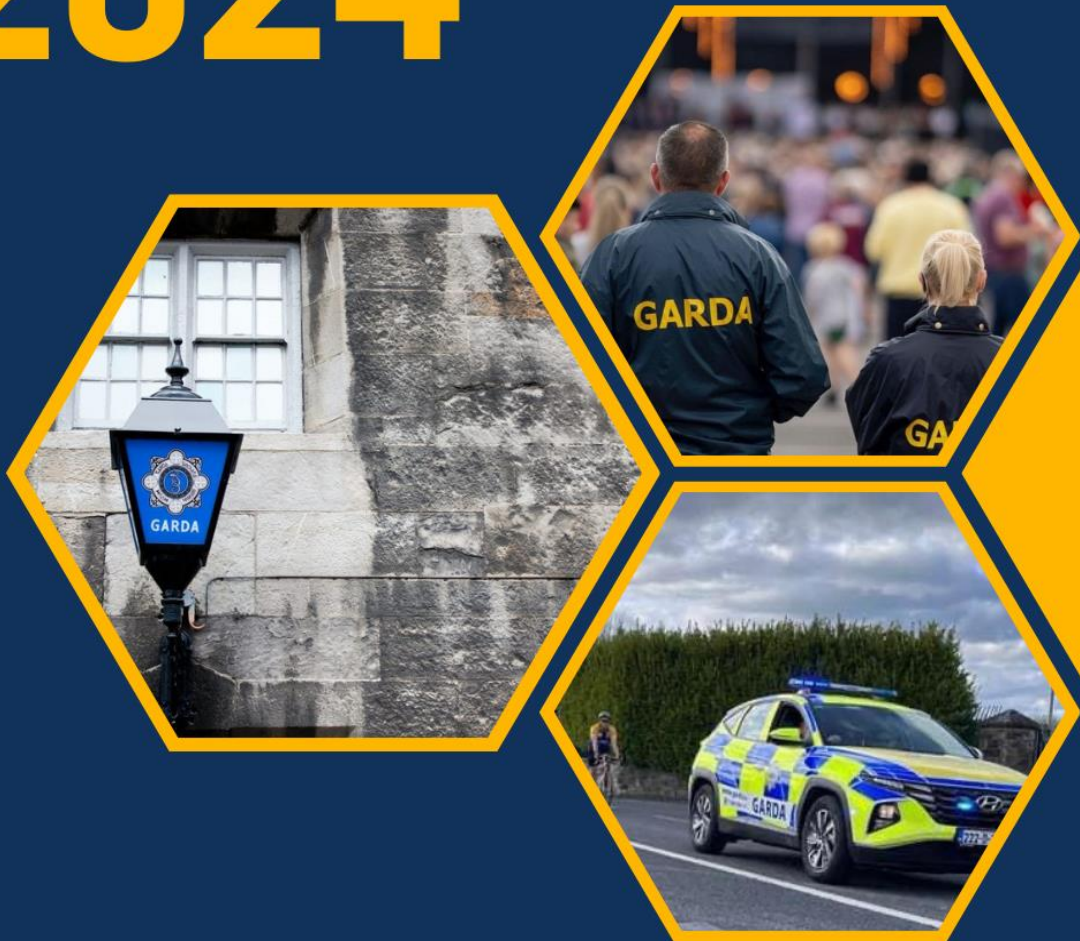

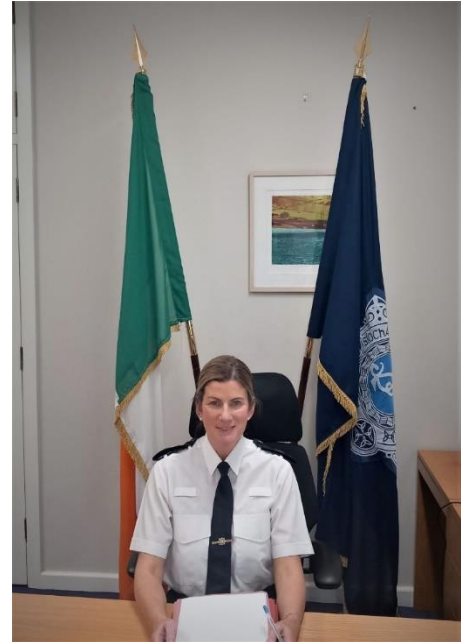

## Divisional Officer's Foreword

It is my privilege, as newly appointed Chief Superintendent of the Clare/Tipperary Division, to introduce our Divisional Policing Plan for 2024. The goals set out in this plan, are aligned with those in the 2024 National Policing Plan, whilst also taking cognisance of feedback we have received from the people of Clare and Tipperary, including engagement through fora such as Divisional Joint Policing Committees, community groups, statutory groups and non governmental organisations.

This plan is very sensitive to the needs of our communities and cognisant of local factors that impinge on safety and security of our citizens, and challenge the spirit and resilience of our communities across Tipperary and Clare. The focus of this plan is on Community Policing, and preventing and detecting crime.



During 2024 we will continue to implement National Initiatives such as Operation Faoiseamh, to support and protect the victims of domestic abuse, and Operation Tara, to disrupt, dismantle and prosecute drug trafficking networks.

Unfortunately in 2023, in the Clare/Tipperary Division, twenty two people lost their lives on our divisional roads, with many others receiving significant injuries. I would like to re-iterate our commitment to try and reduce the carnage and death on our roads, and the tragedy and subsequent heartbreak visited on the victims and families as a result.

Finally, I would like to recognise the efforts of the members of staff working for An Garda Síochána in the Clare/Tipperary Division, especially those who are on the frontline 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. Their flexibility and commitment has in no small way contributed, and continues to contribute, to ensuring that the most violent, dangerous and committed criminals are challenged, constrained and stand answerable to the rule of law. An Garda Síochána in Clare/Tipperary will continue to deliver a responsive, reliable and respectful service for the people of Clare/Tipperary and will work tirelessly to keep you safe in our communities during 2024.
