Policing Plan 2024 is the final annual plan for the Mayo/Roscommon/Longford Division under the 2022-2024 Strategy Statement. Huge progress has been delivered to meet the needs of an-ever changing Irish Society. The continued role out of the Operating Model will deliver streamlined, efficient structures focused on Community Partnerships, Proactive Policing and prioritising the support of Victims. This is demonstrated through the activities, developments and opportunities outlined within the Mayo/Roscommon/Longford Divisional Policing Plan 2024. Enhancing Community Safety and reducing the fear of Crime, while also preventing Crime from happening will continue to be prioritised.

The 2024 Divisional Policing Plan for the Mayo/Roscommon/Longford Division reflects the enhancement and evolvement of a modern Policing Service provided in these three Counties. This plan sets out how An Garda Síochána will continue to uphold our core commitment to *Keeping People Safe*, grounded in the principles of our Code of Ethics and our dedication to Human Rights. We will achieve this through initiatives relating to our Diversity and Inclusion Strategy, Hate Crime Policy and developing our Human Rights Capacity.

An Garda Síochána's Strategy Statement 2022-2024 is a roadmap, a way for us to achieve our goals and assist us in improving the service we provide to the public we are so proud to serve. The plan was created through consultation with our Communities, feedback from Divisional Staff and external Stakeholders. To deliver an effective policing service requires the support of our local Communities, we will continue to work with that Community and Voluntary Groups at a local level, to ensure the common goal of a safe environment in which to live. An Garda Síochána will continue to enforce road traffic legislation and make our roads a safer place throughout 2024.
