Divisional Officer's Foreword

I look forward to 2024 in my role leading the team of Garda members and staff in the Meath Westmeath Division. This will be the first full year using the new Garda Operating Model, which is focused on community policing with specialist teams helping in areas of crime, governance, and business support. The attached plan shows our priority areas for the coming year, and in particular what we will do locally to implement the plan in the division.

During 2023, we introduced a number of significant changes to the way we work, including the Garda Safe system for managing our response to calls for service and a roster duty management system. We also formally merged both counties into the division of Meath and Westmeath as part of our new Operating Model. I'd like to acknowledge the commitment of Garda members and staff in engaging with these changes, as adopting to new ways of work is often challenging. 2024 should bring a more stable change environment as there are fewer significant new systems scheduled and our focus will be on building capacity in our teams.

Good partnerships are essential to good policing, and in that regard I would like to thank those in our communities, other state agencies, and civil society for their collaboration in helping to keep people safe. We rely heavily on support from our external partners and members of the public; this includes people drawing attention to issues. I would ask that anyone who needs a Garda response to call 999 or 112 rather than your local Garda station, as this is the quickest way to access our Garda Safe system.

While it is true that policing can be a challenging job, it is also a very rewarding one, where Garda members and staff provide an important service to the public. I would encourage anyone thinking of a new career to look at <u>www.publicjobs.ie</u> for recruitment opportunities as a Garda member or Garda staff. In order to be connected to the community, we need to reflect the community and accordingly, age and other criteria for entry have changed to allow for a more diverse team.

Finally, I would like to thank the communities of Meath and Westmeath for their continued support and trust. I hope that a combination of increased recruitment, our Operating Model and improved systems will allow us to provide a better police service and help keep communities safe during 2024.
