We will prioritise providing services to victims of crime and in particular those who are most vulnerable within society. We value the importance of building new partnerships and enhancing our engagement with the community in line with our central mission of "**Keeping People Safe**". We remain fully committed to our positive obligations under Section 42 of the Irish Human Rights and Equality Act 2014 and will enhance this in 2024 and by building our capacity through the following Strategies:-

- Organised Crime Gang Strategy
- Operation Dualgas Protection and Security our Coastline and Waterways
- Diversity, Equality, Inclusion and Transparency Strategy

I am confident that the initiatives outlined in this plan will make a real difference to the communities of Counties Sligo and Leitrim which we are proud to serve. I look forward to meeting the challenges in the year ahead and encourage feedback from interested parties on any aspect of the Policing Plan now being embarked on for 2024.
