Listening to public concerns and being accountable for local measures/action plans in relation to public protests, public disorder and anti-social behaviour. Divisional Drugs Unit/ Community Policing/ Crime Prevention Officers working together in our community with other community stakeholders to help educate about dangers of drug use, drug debt intimidation etc.
- 1.2 Engage across all communities to deliver a policing service that understands and responds to the diverse needs of society
- 1.2 Implementing and reviewing community engagement strategies within the Division, in particular implementing the Garda Diversity and Integration strategy to support diverse communities so as to develop trust and effective communication with marginalised groups. Encourage and facilitate the Reporting, Recording, Investigating and Prosecuting of Hate Crime through support and utilisation of the Divisional Victims Services Offices and Divisional Diversity Officers, so that victims of hate related crime will feel fully supported.
