An Garda Síochána's 2009 Annual Policing Plan is a continuation towards the implementation of the Garda Síochána Corporate Strategy 2007-2009. The plan continues with the modernisation and development of the Garda Síochána. It is focused on public safety, public confidence and transparent public accountability, the three key imperatives of the corporate strategy. It includes the priorities for the Garda Síochána as determined by the Minister for Justice, Equality and Law Reform under Section 20 of the Garda Síochána Act 2005.
