

# Donegal Divisional Policing Plan 2009

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#### FOREWORD FROM THE DONEGAL DIVISIONAL OFFICER.

This Policing Plan represents the goals of An Garda Síochána in the Donegal Division for 2009, with a view to attaining the vision set out in An Garda Síochána Corporate Strategy 2007-2009. In preparing this policing plan, I have sought submissions from our stakeholders (including public representatives, Donegal County Council, HSE and local community groups) throughout Donegal. I received a number of excellent submissions and many aspects of those submissions have been incorporated into the Plan.

There continues to be a significant threat from dissident republicans within Donegal division. In 2008, there were a number of dissident related incidents, the most serious of which was the murder of Andrew Burns on 12<sup>th</sup> February. I intend allocating a Detective Sergeant to Ballybofey during 2009 to co-ordinate and improve border operations to counter this threat.

There will be an increased emphasis on targeting property crime in 2009. I intend to enhance crime prevention by appointing an assistant to the Crime Prevention Officer. There will be targeted operations against specific individuals and gangs involved in persistent property crime. Drugs enforcement will be continued through targeted operations and by maintaining the strength of divisional drugs units.



The strict enforcement of road traffic legislation and mandatory alcohol breath testing contributed to a significant reduction in the number of fatalities on the roads in Donegal in 2008. An Garda Síochána, along with its partners in the Donegal Road Safety Working Group, will continue its efforts throughout 2009 with a view to further improving road safety in Donegal. The establishment of a Divisional Traffic Corps in Dunfanaghy will be prioritised to improve road safety in the west of the County, including Milford and Glenties Districts. A number of vehicles with ANPR (Automated Number Plate Reading) are now in operation in the Division and these will be used in targeting prolific road traffic offenders, criminals and stolen vehicles.

Joint Policing Committees will be established in Buncrana and Bundoran. A number of Community Alert and Neighbourhood Watch schemes will be rejuvenated during the year. A national community policing strategy will be rolled out during the year and in this context, I intend to increase the number of Gardaí attached to community policing units throughout the Division to ensure that An Garda Síochána is more visible and accessible to the community in general.

On the accommodation front, the custody suite in Letterkenny will be fully operational by the end of the first quarter. The new station in Buncrana will be opened during the third quarter. The project of sourcing Garda accommodation on Arranmore Island will continue as well as the acquisition of suitable accommodation at Carndonagh. A Divisional property and exhibits store will be established at Letterkenny station.

All Garda operations throughout 2009 will be conducted in the context of the current budgetary constraints. My management team and I will endeavour to maximise operations within budget to deliver the best possible policing service to the people of Donegal Division.
