The 2010 DMR (Traffic) Division Policing Plan is the first annual Plan of the Garda Corporate Strategy 2010 – 2012 "Working with Communities" with its four core values of Honesty, Accountability, Respect and Professionalism.



The Development of Organisational Capabilities in Roads Policing has brought with it a fundamental change in work practices at DMR (Traffic) Division in September 2009, and I want to record here my appreciation to all members for their co-operation in what was a smooth transition to ensure that the Roads Policing Service we provide to the Public is enhanced. The GRA, AGSI and HRM greatly contributed to the process and this is acknowledged.

My Management team and I are committed to delivering strong leadership and a Professional Policing Service, within budget, to the highest Professional, Ethnical and Human Rights standards.

Our priorities this year include a strong emphasis on speed, which, like impaired driving, has become socially unacceptable. The Garda Analysis Service has recommended a focus in the 50kph zones where vulnerable road users (pedestrians, pedal cycles and motor cycles) are most at risk.

This Policing Plan could not have been achieved without the key contribution of our Stakeholders, both external and internal (including the National Transport Authority which was established on 1<sup>st</sup> December 2009), with the overall aim of meeting the Governments Road Safety Strategy 2007-2012.

### Draft Priorities for An Garda Síochána for 2010 Determined by the Minister for Justice, Equality and Law Reform

#### Background

The function of the Garda Síochána under Section 7 of the Garda Síochána Act 2005 is to provide policing and security services for the State with the objective of:

- (a) Preserving peace and public order,
- (b) Protecting life and property
- (c) Vindicating the human rights of each individual
- (d) Protecting the security of the State,
- (e) Preventing crime
- (f) Bringing criminals to justice, including by detecting and investigating crime,
- (g) Regulating and controlling road traffic and improving road safety;

and carrying out such other functions conferred by law, including those relating to immigration.

In producing his Policing Plan the Garda Commissioner is required to have regard to the priorities of the Minister for Justice, Equality and Law Reform and to the Garda Strategy Statement. The Commissioner is also required to have regard to relevant Government policy. This includes the provisions of the Programme for Government and the specific Government strategies in relation to drugs, youth justice, victims of crime, road safety, and on domestic and sexual violence.

#### Priorities for 2010:-

The Minister has determined the following matters as priorities for the Garda Síochána for 2010 in accordance with Section 20 of the Garda Síochána Act 2005.

#### Security:-

To protect the State and the people against terrorism in all its forms.

#### Crime:-

To combat serious crime, in particular organised crime.

#### **Policing Communities:-**

To achieve the maximum levels of safety for local communities.

#### **Customer Service:-**

To complete and implement a Garda Charter which will improve the Garda response to calls for service and which will contain commitments on the level of community policing service which the public can expect from Gardaí.

#### Roads Policing:-

To police the roads, in particular to reduce the number of deaths and serious injuries arising from collisions.

#### Human Trafficking:-

To prevent and detect human trafficking and to protect victims.
