Foreword by Chief Superintendent Aidan Reid, DMR (Traffic) Division.

This 2011 DMR (Traffic) Division Policing Plan outlines our strategic goals for the second year of the Garda Corporate Strategy 2010 – 2012 "Working with Communities", with its four core values of Honesty, Accountability, Respect and Professionalism (H.A.R.P.).

The first year Plan (2010) was significant in the development of a Casualty Reduction Implementation Plan in the DMR which achieved a marked reduction in fatalities. This Casualty Reduction Plan was developed in close cooperation with the Garda Síochána Analysis Service (G.S.A.S.) and key transport stakeholders in the DMR. It will form a central element in this years' plan, targeting two critical periods in the year which have shown significant increases in fatalities over the past number of years in the DMR with the overall aim of further reducing casualties across Dublin.



Our priorities for Roads Policing this year include a strong emphasis on speed which, like impaired driving and aggressive driving, has become socially unacceptable. High visibility and enforcement activity will be central to engendering habitual compliance, along with disrupting criminality. A desired development is to increase the capability of all the Divisional and District resources within the DMR to work on the basis of a regional strategy in reducing casualties on our roads.

This Divisional Plan includes responsibility for the development of Major Emergency Management for the Eastern Region, with a particular focus on Senior Management Awareness Programmes and preparation of a booklet for operational members. The Major Emergency Plans are also being revised along with developing site specific templates for each Division.

My management team and I are committed to delivering strong leadership as a professional Police service, within budget. With the commitment of all Garda and Civilian personnel within this Division, these policing challenges can be met.

This Policing Plan could not have been developed without the contribution of all our stakeholders, both external and internal, who were invited to contribute, with the overall aim of meeting the challenges of the Government Road Safety Strategy 2007 – 2012.


