The Policing Plan for 2013 incorporates the strategic policing objectives set out by the Garda Commissioner in An Garda Síochána's Annual Policing Plan 2013. - Proactive Policing Operations.
- Ensuring Safe Communities
- Delivering a professional Service.

As well as our values, the plan reflects the vision and mission of An Garda Síochána, as articulated in our Strategy Statement 2013-2015 and every effort has been made to place the issues and priorities of the communities we serve at the centre of our ambitions for 2013.

Domestic and Sexual Violence.

To prevent domestic, sexual and gender based violence and to effectively tackle such violence when it occurs.

To continue to reduce the number of deaths and serious injuries on our roads arising from collisions.

To promote efficiencies in resource allocation and deployment to enhance the policing service provided to the public.
