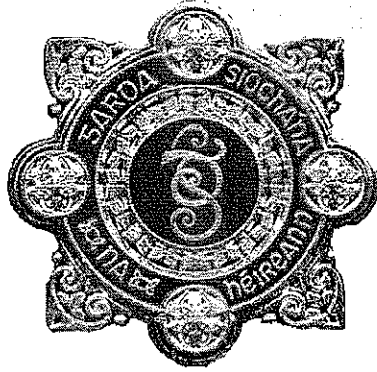

## Divisional Policing Plan 2005 – Wexford/Wicklow Division

- In consultation with District Officers, the Inspector at Wexford to review on a quarterly basis the divisional operations and results in the area of drug enforcement.
- District Officers to liaise with other interested agencies regarding the issue of drugs talks to young people aimed at diverting them away from drugs.
- Inspector at Wexford in conjunction with District Officers to strengthen Coastal Watch and Database.
- Promote the uptake of Age Cards.
- Increase detections for underage drinking, supplying drink to underage persons, and after-hours trading.
- Achieve a reduction in headline crime committed and an increase in the detection rate of headline crime.
- Each District Officer to maintain top ten in each category. Inspector at Wicklow to monitor Divisional Lists. (Inspector at Wexford to monitor Drugs List).
- Increase public satisfaction by keeping victims of crime updated on case progress and that victims of sexual crime continue to be treated in a sensitive manner.
- Garda Policy on Domestic Violence will be fully enforced to ensure consistency of response to victims.



## Divisional Policing Plan 2005 – Wexford/Wicklow Division

- Monitor incidents of repeat victimization and plan preventative patrols based on crime and offence patterns, victim reports and other available patterns. Services of C.P.O. should be utilised.
- A thorough examination and revitalization of Neighbourhood Watch / Community Alert / Business Watch Schemes will be conducted in each District and there will be a drive to revitalise dormant schemes and introduce new schemes to new areas.
- Maintain liaison with local media to assist in crime prevention and detection.
- Endeavour to increase referrals to victim support and tourist victim support.
- Ensure ongoing training in the area of Children First.
- Continue to foster good inter-agency co-operation with Health Boards and other State Agencies.
- Juvenile Offenders to be dealt with in a proactive manner through Juvenile Diversion Scheme.
- Target local and traveling criminal gangs operating within Division and where necessary utilise the services provided by National Units in this regard.
- Continue to support Special Projects in Wexford and Wicklow.
