

FOREWORD FROM THE DONEGAL DIVISIONAL OFFICER.

The 2007 annual Policing Plan for Donegal division is the first step towards the implementation of the An Garda Síochána Corporate Strategy 2007-2009. There will be significant change in the structures of An Garda Síochána in the next three years and there will be considerable challenges ahead as the organisation adapts and embraces change.

An Garda Síochána will actively implement an improved accountability framework with participation in Joint Policing Committees, the introduction of the Garda Síochána Inspectorate



and the Garda Ombudsman Commission. There will be a renewed focus on community policing. The needs of our customers will influence everything that the Gardaí strive to do. It is expected that this improved accountability will manifest itself in an improvement in satisfaction with the Garda service in Donegal in the annual Public Attitude Survey.

I am confident that the actions and performance indicators outlined in this plan will contribute to an effective policing service in the coming year. Significant advances were achieved in relation to crime investigation and detection in 2006 and I expect the improvements to continue in 2007. The headline detection rate in Donegal division in 2006 was 41%.

I have placed an emphasis on strict enforcement of road traffic legislation and mandatory alcohol breath testing with a view to reducing the number of fatal and serious traffic collisions on the roads in Donegal. It is incumbent on An Garda Síochána and society in general to adopt a zero tolerance attitude to drink driving. Gardaí will also be concentrating on driver behaviour in general with a view to eradicating the culture of poor driving behaviour which has been present among certain motorists in Donegal for too long.

All members of An Garda Síochána in Donegal are anxious to learn from the mistakes of the past and will strive for total customer satisfaction in everything we do. Our actions will be underpinned by the principles of fairness and impartiality. Where the quality of service is not what it should be, we will strive to improve systems to prevent a recurrence.

Policing, by it's nature, is always evolving and a policing plan must be flexible enough to allow for any contingency that may arise. I would appreciate the views of the general public and other stakeholders on this policing plan. I will be happy to consider any submissions on this plan with a view to improving this plan and future plans.
