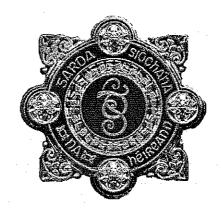

ROAD TRAFFIC/TRANSPORT: ENFORCEMENT

An active involvement of all uniform personnel in road traffic operations and initiatives to improve road safety to achieve the targets established in the National Plan.

ROAD SAFETY PROMOTION:

To utilise every opportunity to promote road safety to all age groups, through the Garda Schools Programme and to the public generally through local radio/media

COLLISION PREVENTION PROGRAMME: ENGINEERING

District Officers to promote the CPP through active co-operation with other agencies involved and by having regular meetings with District Teams and local authority personnel to design out black spots.

TRAFFIC FLOW/MANAGEMENT:

District Officers to ensure that all villages / towns located on or near National Primary routes in Division receive adequate traffic management to ensure free movement of traffic, particularly on bank-holiday weekends. Traffic management at major events will also receive attention.
