Honesty – Being honest and ethical, adhering to the principles of fairness and justice **Accountability** – Accepting individual responsibility and ensuring public accountability **Respect** – Having respect for people, their Human Rights and their needs **Professionalism** – Providing a professional policing service to all communities

This plan details the ways in which we will maintain our focus on, and commitment to our core activity which is the prevention and detection of crime. All of the resources available in the Region will be used effectively and efficiently towards meeting this overall objective. The strategies and goals contained in the Policing Plan are designed to improve the sense of security in ensuring a peaceful community in the Northern Region which has extensive frontiers with Northern Ireland.
