I refer to your request, dated and received on the 22nd March, 2018 which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 (FOI Act) for records held by An Garda Síochána.

Part 1(n) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act states that An Garda Síochána is listed as a partially included agency "insofar as it relates to administrative records relating to human resources, or finance or procurement matters". Therefore, only administrative records that relate to human resources, finance or procurement shall be considered.

I wish to inform you that I have decided to grant your request on the 9th April, 2018.

The purpose of this letter is to explain my decision.

1. Findings, particulars and reasons for decision

Details of your request were provided to the Health and Safety Section of An Garda Síochána to identify records containing the information you have requested. Two records have been identified relating to your request.

I have made a decision to grant access to these records under the FOI Act.

Please find appended:

Appendix A – Occupational Injuries 2017 - Male **Appendix B** – Occupational Injuries 2017 - Female

Please note that a new category of occupational injury is included in these records entitled "Body movement (Resulting in injury)" to capture injuries sustained by personnel relating to strains and pulled muscles. These are outlined in both Appendix A and B.

An Garda Síochána have a duty of care to their members in the event of an occupational injury. In this regard there are a number of services available to members who suffer an injury on duty.

The primary service available is that of the Occupational Health Service whose role is to advise the Garda Commissioner on fitness for duty, and to protect, maintain and promote the health of all Garda employees. The Service currently consists of two Specialist Occupational Health Physicians including the Chief Medical Officer, three Occupational Health Nurses, and Administration staff. Sessional nurses and doctors including occupational health physicians also enhance the capacity of the Service. The Service is also complemented by access to expertise of independent specialist medical advisors in various specialities.

An Garda Síochána is very mindful to the significant occupational demands placed on its members and the exposure to very stressful and traumatic situations. In this context, the implementation of 24/7 independent counselling service for Garda members, reserves and Civilian staff attached to An Garda Síochána is now available to all members of the force.

Requests for counselling services by members can be sought after a traumatic incident dealt with by an individual member or a number of members of An Garda Síochána. Counselling services are available for local management to utilise at their discretion to ensure the health and welfare of their staff. Members dealing with traumatic incidents, such as fatal road traffic collisions or sudden deaths and other such events will on occasion require the expertise of a professional counselling service to reduce the possible impact of dealing with an upsetting event.

2. Right of Appeal

The making of a late appeal may be permitted in appropriate circumstances.
