Dear

I refer to your request, dated 4th November, 2019 and received on 5th November, 2019 which you have made under the Freedom of Information Act 2014 (FOI Act) for records held by An Garda Síochána.

Part 1(n) of Schedule 1 of the FOI Act states that An Garda Síochána is listed as a partially included agency "insofar as it relates to administrative records relating to human resources, or finance or procurement matters". Therefore, only administrative records that relate to human resources, finance or procurement shall be considered.

Your request sought:

- 1. Details of the spend on personal protective equipment/safety gear for gardai from 1 January 2018 to 31 December 2018. Please include breakdown of the spend on PPE/safety gear as follows: riot helmets; riot shields; anti-stab vests; hi-vis garda jackets; knee protective pads and elbow protective pads.
- 2. Details of clerical allowances paid to gardai between 1 January 2018 to 31 December 2018. Please include the total amount paid to gardai and the number of individual recipients.
- 3. Details, including a breakdown of the cost, of the two rainbow-design Garda vehicles that were added to the fleet ahead of the Dublin Pride Parade in June 2019.
- 4. Details of the costs associated with Garda Mounted Unit and The Garda Dog Unit between 1 January 2018 and 31 December 2018. Please include a breakdown of costs, including but not limited to the purchase of new animals, vet costs, animal feed, kennelling services and grooming services.

I wish to inform you that I have decided to part-grant your request on the 5th December, 2019.

The purpose of this letter is to explain my decision.

1. Findings, particulars and reasons for decision

Upon receipt, details of your request were provided to the Finance Directorate and the Procurements Section within An Garda Síochána who conducted a search for records relating to your request.

Table A below sets out the total amount paid in respect of the purchase of clothing (protective material and specialised equipment) in 2018. The costs are categorised under two financial subheads *i.e. Purchase of Clothing — Protective Material* and *Purchase of Clothing — Specialised Equipment*: (as previously released in FOI-000262-2019)

In respect of the second part of part 1 of your request you sought 'a breakdown of the spend on PPE/safety gear, including Riot Helmets, Riot Shields, Anti Stab Vests, Hi-Vis Garda Jackets, Knee protective pads and Elbow protective pads.' This was forwarded to the Procurement Section who has provided the following records:

^{*} Anti-Stab/Ballistic Vests include both uniformed and plain clothes member's vests.

The Garda uniform incorporates elements of Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) which are appropriate for the duties being performed. Certain types of duty require specific PPE elements to be included in the uniforms such as motorcycle and air support duties. On entering the Garda College, a student is provided with a standard uniform which consists of

the following items:

•	Epaulettes	 Trousers 	 High Visibility Waterproof Jacket

•	T -Shirts	 Shoes 	 Anti-Stab Vest

Each member of the force is required to maintain an operational and a formal uniform. It is a disciplinary offence not to comply with An Garda Síochána dress code or to be untidy in uniform.

The specialist equipment assigned to each member of An Garda Síochána serves an operational requirement within the environment in which they operate. Equipment such as Riot Helmets, Riot Shields and Protective Pads as specified in your request are required in highly volatile situations to protect Garda members when dealing with public disorder and violent incidents. The equipment serves as a protective measure in these types of situations allowing Gardaí to carry out their functions to protect society and preserve the peace.

The Anti-Stab Vest is a vital part of equipment issued to members of An Garda Síochána for their personal protection. Similarly, Ballistic Vests are issued to members of specific units of An Garda Síochána. The Hi-Visibility jackets are also a very important part of Garda protective equipment and the jacket is designed to provide a high level of visibility when a Garda is on outdoor duty, especially at night time and when on traffic-related duties.

Part 2 of your request sought 'details of clerical allowances paid to Gardaí between 1st January 2018 and 31st December 2018'. The table below sets out the total amount paid in respect of Clerical Allowances in 2018:

Clerical/Administrative Designated Post Allowance

A member who is employed in a "Garda" designated clerical/administrative post may* receive a designated post allowance. A member occupying a (Civilian) non-designated post may* be paid an ex-gratia sum, equivalent to the allowances mentioned at subsection (1), while he/she occupies such post. Eligibility for the ex-gratia sum will be subject to the following provisions:

- (a) That the member opted to transfer to outdoor duties; and
- (b) That it is not practicable to release the member from the post he/she occupies.

Only members who are employed in posts requiring attendance between 9.15am and 5.15pm on each day between Monday to Friday inclusive, e.g. Clerical posts or similar posts, will be entitled to receive the allowance (or the ex-gratia sum). Members who are in

receipt of other allowances for special duties, will not be eligible to the paid allowance (or ex-gratia sum) under the terms of this section.

* It should be noted that by way of Government decision of 18th September 2012 both the Clerical Designated allowance and the Clerical Ex-gratia Allowance was abolished for new beneficiaries with effect from 1St February 2012. Any member of An Garda Siochána who takes up a post mentioned at (1) or (2) above will not be paid the relevant allowance if they are deemed to be a new beneficiary.

Part 3 of your request sought "Details, including a breakdown of the cost, of the two rainbowdesign Garda vehicles that were added to the fleet ahead of the Dublin Pride Parade in June 2019.

The Finance Directorate have informed this office that there was no cost to An Garda Síochána in respect of this and I am therefore refusing this part of your request in accordance with Section 15(1)(a) of the FOI Act which states:

Refusal on administrative grounds to grant FOI requests:

15(1) A head to whom an FOI request is made may refuse to grant the request where
(a) the record concerned does not exist or cannot be found after all reasonable steps to ascertain its whereabouts have been taken,
